ORDER GRANTING MOTION FOR LEAVE TO FILE REPLY TO
OPPOSITION TO MOTION FOR LEAVE TO AMEND COMPLAINT
AND
ORDER POSTPONING PRE-HEARING CONFERENCE

On February 11, 2013, counsel for the Consumer Product Safety Commission (“CPSC” or “Agency”) filed Complaint Counsel’s Motion for Leave to File Second Amended Complaints in Docket Nos. 12-1 and 12-2 (“Motion”). In the Motion, the Agency sought, *inter alia*, to add Craig Zucker as a Respondent in Docket No. 12-1, both in his individual capacity and in his capacity as Chief Executive Officer.

On February 20, 2013, Craig Zucker filed a Request to Participate in the Proceeding as Non-Party Participant and For Leave to File an Opposition to Complaint Counsel’s Motion for Leave to Amend Complaint by February 28, 2013 (“Request”). On February 25, 2013, the undersigned issued an Order granting the Request. Thereafter, on February 28, 2013, Craig Zucker filed an Opposition to Motion for Leave to Amend Complaint in CPSC Docket 12-1.

On March 1, 2013, the Agency filed Complaint Counsel's Motion for Leave to File a Reply to Mr. Zucker's Opposition to Complaint Counsel's Motion for Leave to Amend Complaint in CPSC Docket 12-1 ("Motion for Leave"). In the Motion for Leave, CPSC requested ten (10) days to respond to Mr. Zucker's Opposition, explaining that Mr. Zucker did not oppose the Agency's Motion for Leave.

WHEREFORE,

The Agency's Motion for Leave to File a Reply to Opposition to Motion for Leave to File Amended Complaint is **GRANTED**. Agency counsel may file a Reply to Mr. Zucker's Opposition not later than **Friday, March 15, 2013**.

The pre-hearing conference scheduled for March 6, 2013 for the consolidated case is hereby **POSTPONED**.
