

LEAD WARNING

Metal Toy Jewelry Sold in Vending Machines Can Contain Dangerous Levels of Lead.



This toy jewelry recall involves various styles of rings, necklaces and bracelets.

Four toy jewelry importers have recalled 150 million pieces of toy jewelry sold in vending machines nationwide from January 2002 through June 2004.

The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) has determined that some of this toy jewelry contains dangerous levels of lead, posing a risk of lead poisoning to children. While only about half the recalled jewelry actually contains lead, the industry has recalled all of it because it is difficult to distinguish the lead jewelry from the non-lead jewelry.

Check to see if your child has any recalled toy jewelry, and, if so, THROW IT AWAY!
