MODIFICATION 15 OF THE INTERAGENCY AGREEMENT BETWEEN
THE U.S. CONSUMER PRODUCT SAFETY COMMISSION (CPSC92-1117)
AND THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION (98FED05408-15)

This Modification Number 15 is issued to:

1. Amend Section IV - Scope of Work as follows: IV (2) and (5) - change September 30, 2003 (Modification No. 14) to read September 30, 2004. IV (9) - Change September 30, 2003 (Modification No.14) to read: September 30, 2004. Approximate delivery date for calendar year 2003 data is September 30, 2004.

Add No (14) to read: The Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) will continue to collect surveillance data on all firearm injury cases initially treated in emergency departments (EDs) of all 100 NEISS hospitals in the new sampling frame. The period of performance is from the date that both parties sign the agreement through September 30, 2004.

2. Amend Section V (Modification No.13) to read as follows: CDC will effect the transfer of \$49,706 to CPSC in fiscal year 2004 to support CPSC's continuing NEISS Firearm Injury Surveillance System data collection activities including travel costs associated with conducting quality assurance joint site visits with CDC.
