This will acknowledge receipt of your August 31, 1992 letter to John W. Norris, Jr. as part of the Consumer Product Safety Commission's policy of sharing complaints and investigative reports concerning injuries or potential injuries associated with products of manufacturers. The materials attached to your letter discuss an alleged soot and foul order incident involving Hollis and Elaine Thayer at their home in Wisconsin. The incident allegedly involved a Lennox system.

We, as a general practice, take any such report regarding our products very seriously regardless of the source of the report. Lennox is already involved in active litigation with the Thayers in this matter and undertook an investigation to determine the cause of the alleged foul order and soot and to determine whether this incident constituted a substantial product hazard or whether Lennox has any obligation under Section 15 of the Consumer Product Safety Act or otherwise.


After a review of the materials provided and its own investigation, Lennox has concluded that the alleged foul order and soot is unrelated to the design or any defect in the Lennox system. Lennox is actively defending this litigation brought by the Thayers on the basis that the Thayers' complaints which are raised in their report to the CPSC are without merit as they relate to Lennox Industries Inc.

Consequently, it is the conclusion of Lennox Industries Inc. that neither this report nor any other information available to Lennox reasonably would support a conclusion that this incident constituted a substantial product hazard or that Lennox has any obligation under Section 15 of the Consumer Product Safety Act.



I was told that he was no longer involved in the case and that I should therefore contact the homeowner. I therefore contacted the heating contractor's attorney and was told that no additional test results were available beyond what is already contained in my original report. He stated that due to the plaintiff changing attorney's all new experts have been contacted to work on the case, none of which have completed any substantial testing or issued any reports as of this date.


I again requested that I be copied in on any test results or conclusions reached in the future, and the attorney agreed stating that my name is still contained in his file for that purpose.

Should any additional information become available in the future it will be forwarded as another addendum to this report.




Substance Found on Bottom Grating of

Furnace Fan-Removed to View Bottom of Heat Exchanger-Fins also showed tar/pitch type substance.




Upper portion of furnace Interior






Furnace Serial Number




Outside Air Vent Piping






Lennox Pulse

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
