Dear Mr. Kurtas or Mrs. Kay:

Thank you for your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request seeking information from the Commission. The records from the Commission files responsive to your request have been processed and copies of the releasable responsive records are enclosed. The enclosed records include file information generated by the Commission itself or its contractors for regulatory or enforcement purposes. These records are in a file maintained in the Commission's field files and are identified as Establishment Inspection Reports, Laboratory Summaries, memoranda, correspondence, notes and documents. The Commission has established management systems under which supervisors are responsible for reviewing the work of their employees or contractors. The file information materials are final and have been prepared and accepted by the Commission's staff under such review systems. The Commission believes that it has taken reasonable steps to assure the accuracy of the information

The enclosed records include seven Epidemiologic Investigation Reports with the underlying and supporting documentation. (Some of the reports also appear in the Field file.) The Commission has received this information from its formal investigation systems. Through these systems the Commission hopes to learn when specific products are associated with illness, injury or death. The Commission believes that it has taken reasonable steps to assure the accuracy of this information. While conducting the interviews for the investigation reports, Commission staff or contractors have spoken with the individuals involved or with others who witnessed or are familiar with the incidents. Where possible, Commission staff have examined the products reportedly involved in the incidents. Although the Commission has investigated the incidents described in the investigation reports, the Commission has not necessarily determined the cause of the incidents.

Also enclosed are records pertaining to eleven product complaints and reported incidents that were submitted to the Commission by consumers and others. The consumers or submitters have confirmed the accuracy of the information in the complaints and reported incidents. The Commission has neither investigated the incidents nor conducted or obtained any evaluations of the products that corroborate the substance of the information contained in the complaints and reported incidents. In some of the complaints and reported incidents we have removed the identities of the complainants at their request.

The other records from the Commission files responsive to your request relate to ten product complaints and reported incidents that the Commission has obtained from consumers, attorneys for consumers and others. The Commission has not received confirmation of the accuracy of the information in the complaints and reported incidents. Pursuant to Exemption 3 of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(3) and section 6(b)(1) of the Consumer Product Safety Act (CPSA), 15 U.S.C. § 2055(b)(1), and our regulations, 16 C.F.R. § 1101.32, we must withhold the unconfirmed product complaints and reported incidents.

FOIA Exemption 3 provides for the withholding from disclosure of matters that are specifically exempted from disclosure by another statute. In applying FOIA Exemption 3, we are relying on section 6(b)(1) of the CPSA. That section prohibits the Commission from disclosing information about a consumer product that identifies a manufacturer or private labeler unless the Commission has taken "reasonable steps" to assure that the information is accurate, that disclosure is fair in the circumstances, and that disclosure will be reasonably related to effectuating the purposes of the laws that the Commission administers. See Commission regulation, 16 C.F.R. § 1101.32. The Commission's policy is to withhold each consumer complaint and reported incident unless: (1) the Commission has conducted an investigation of the complaint and reported incident, and the investigation corroborates the substance of the complaint and reported incident; (2) the Commission has conducted or obtained a technical, scientific, or other evaluation of the product that is the subject of the complaint and reported incident, and evaluation corroborates the substance of the information contained in the complaint and reported incident; or (3) the consumer or person reporting or submitting the incident confirms the accuracy of the information. The Commission did not take any of these steps with regard to these certain consumer complaints and reported incidents responsive to your request. While it has been Commission practice since June 1983 to seek confirmation of incoming consumer complaints and incidents, the Commission does not have the resources to seek confirmation of the complaints and incidents where a consumer has not responded to our request for confirmation of the information.

You will note that in the documents disclosed information that could identify injured parties and persons treating them has been deleted, because section 25(c) of the CPSA, 15 U.S.C. § 2074(c)(1), prohibits such disclosures without the consent of those individuals. In some cases the parties have denied consent or consent has not otherwise been obtained.

According to the Commission's regulations implementing the FOIA at 16 C.F.R. § 1015.7, a partial denial of access to records may be appealed to the General Counsel of the Commission within thirty (30) days of your receipt of this letter. An appeal must be in writing and addressed to: FOIA APPEAL, General Counsel, ATTN: Office of the Secretary, U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, Washington, D. C. 20207.

Processing this request, performing the file searches and preparing the information, cost the Commission \$120.00. In this instance, we have decided to waive all of the charges. Thank you for your interest in consumer product safety.

Dear Mr. Donath:

This law firm is counsel to Wilsons and is national coordinating counsel for the defense of claims and lawsuits arising from the use of a certain Wilsons leather protector product ("Product"). Your letter of June 11, 1993, to Kenneth A. DellaRocco, has been referred to me for reply.

Please be advised that we cannot voluntarily provide the Consumer Product Safety Commission ("CPSC") with copies of testing results ("Tests") concerning the Product. As Mr. DellaRocco suggested in his letter to you, were Wilsons voluntarily to disclose the Tests to the CPSC, it might waive the work-product and other protections to which it is entitled. We are also concerned that, once the tests are turned over to the CPSC, they may become available to the general public pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act.

With respect to your questions as to whether the Tests are work-product, following receipt of your letter I spoke with both Mr. DellaRocco and the Wilsons executives responsible for ordering the Tests. My inquiries confirmed that those who ordered the Tests did so in anticipation of litigation that they believed was likely to follow the recall of the Product. Indeed, it is difficult to imagine any responsible executive in similar circumstances having a different view as to the purpose of such tests.

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We appreciate your observation that "Wilson's has cooperated fully" with the CPSC. To the extent Wilson's can continue to cooperate without waiver of its rights, it will do so. In that spirit, and in light of your interest in test results, Wilson's is willing to provide the CPSC with as many samples of the Product as it may need to conduct its own tests. Please feel free to contact me if that would be useful.

As you requested, I am enclosing a schedule of the Tests performed at Wilson's request. Each are protected by the attorney work-product doctrine and other federal and state laws.

As you know, I inspected Wilsons House of Suede on December 29, 1993 and spoke extensively with Mr. Paul Tomlinson, Vice President. In subsequent conversations, Mr. Tomlinson indicated that Wilsons was having toxicological testing done of the product and promised to provide the results of those tests to the Commission when they were complete. Mr. Tomlinson never suggested that those tests were done at the request of an attorney in anticipation of litigation or otherwise.

Your letter of June 3, 1993 suggests that "Wilson's may have commissioned" the tests requested "in anticipation of the litigation that Wilson's believed would result." However, your letter is very unspecific.

Please provide copies of all reports of any toxicological (including animal) tests conducted for Wilson. If you intend to withhold any documents because you contend they are covered by the work product doctrine, please provide a detailed description of the documents withheld detailing the basis for your claims that the documents are covered by the work product doctrine.

In the past, Wilson has cooperated fully with my investigation. We hope that it will continue to do so. However, if you do not respond to this request within seven days, I shall be forced to refer this matter to our litigation staff for further action.

I am Director of Legal Affairs and Counsel to Melville Corporation, owner of Wilsons House of Suede, Inc. and its divisions and affiliates (collectively "Wilson's"). This letter is in response to your letter dated May 6, 1993, to Mr. Paul Tomlinson, Wilson's Vice President for Marketing.

As you may already know, Wilson's has been named as a defendant in numerous product liability and warranty actions (the "Actions") arising from consumers' alleged use of Wilson's Leather Protector ("Leather Protector"). In your letter to Mr. Tomlinson, you request that Wilson's supply the Consumer Product Safety Commission ("CPSC") with results of certain scientific tests of Leather Protector ("Tests") that Wilson's may have commissioned after it learned of consumers' health complaints and in anticipation of the litigation that Wilson's believed would result.


Although we are eager to cooperate with the CPSC, information and documents concerning any such Tests are subject, at a minimum, to the privileges and protections that attach to trial preparation materials generally (see, e.g., Fed. R. Civ. P. 26(b)(3)), and expert materials in particular (see, e.g., Fed. R. Civ. P. 26(b)(4)). Unfortunately, if Wilson's were to supply the CPSC with copies or information concerning the Tests, it likely would waive these privileges and protections. Our view in this regard is supported by a recent Federal Circuit Court decision, which held that the privileges and protections were waived when a company voluntarily responded to a government agency request for documents. *Westinghouse Electric Corp. v. Republic of the Philippines*, 951 F.2d 1414 (3d Cir. 1991). In order to

preserve its rights in litigation, Wilsons must assert those rights here. Accordingly, Wilsons respectfully declines to furnish the CPSC with the requested information concerning the Tests.

Thank you for your letter dated March 24, 1993 regarding the above product. The Commission has made no investigation as to determining the cause for the complaints on the Wilson's Leather Protector 5 oz. size. If you are able to determine why the product caused the complaints to originate, the Commission would be interested in your findings.

Regarding products in the pump spray container using isooctane (2,2,4-Trimethylpentane), I would have to see current labels and know the formula and characteristics such as viscosity and information listed on Material Safety Data Sheets before any assessment could be made as to whether additional labeling was required for them. If you wish to forward this information to me, I will examine it and provide guidance on any required label content.

I WRITE IN RESPONSE TO YOUR MARCH 1, 1993 LETTER TO ME CONCERNING THE CONSUMER PRODUCT SAFETY COMMISSION'S ANALYSIS OF A 5 OZ. SAMPLE OF THE WILSONS LEATHER PROTECTOR. THANK YOU FOR THAT LETTER OF ADVICE AND FOR YOUR PERMISSION TO REPLY BEYOND THE 10 DAY TIME PERIOD STATED IN THAT LETTER.

BE ASSURED, THAT FROM NOW ON, IF VANGARD MAKES OR DISTRIBUTES ANY PRODUCT, IT WILL INCLUDE WARNINGS CONSISTANT WITH YOUR ADVICE. AS YOU KNOW, WILSONS HAS TAKEN THIS PRODUCT OFF OF ITS SHELVES. AT THIS TIME, VANGARD SELLS NO PRODUCTS WITH THE FORMULA FOUND IN THE WILSONS PRODUCT YOU TESTED AND HAS NO INTENTION TO DO SO.

THOUGH VANGARD NOW SELLS NO PRODUCTS WITH THE SAME FORMULA AS THE 5 OZ WILSONS PRODUCTS, VANGARD DOES SELL PRODUCTS WHICH INCLUDE COMPONENTS FOUND IN THAT WILSONS PRODUCT. FOR EXAMPLE, VANGARD MAKES PUMP SPRAY PRODUCTS WHICH INCLUDE ISOCTANE (PHILLIPS) BUT, OF COURSE, NO AEROSOL PROPELLANT. IF ADDITIONAL LABELLING IS NEEDED FOR ALL PRODUCTS CONTAINING ISOCTANE, PLEASE CONTACT ME AT ONCE. IF YOU WOULD LIKE A SAMPLE OF SUCH A VANGARD PRODUCT, I WILL BE HAPPY TO SEND ONE TO YOU.

VANGARD NO LONGER USES FC3537 (3M) AND I DO NOT BELIEVE THAT FLAMMABILITY IS AN ISSUE WITH THE VYBAR (PETROLITE) IN THE 5 OZ. WILSONS PRODUCT.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION, WE HAVE RECEIVED NO CONSUMER OR RETAILER COMPLAINTS OF PROBLEMS OR INJURIES STEMMING FROM THE FLAMMABILITY OF THE WILSONS PRODUCT.

AS YOU NOTED, VANGARD HAS RECEIVED CONSUMER COMPLAINTS OF RESPIRATORY PROBLEMS CONCERNING THE 5 OZ WILSONS PRODUCT. SINCE YOUR LETTER DID NOT ADDRESS THOSE COMPLAINTS AND SINCE I KNOW THAT THE CPSC IS AWARE OF THOSE COMPLAINTS, I WILL NOT GO INTO THAT MATTER IN THIS REPLY TO YOUR ADVICE REGARDING FLAMMABILITY. HOWEVER, VANGARD IS STILL TRYING TO DETERMINE THE CAUSE OF THE

**HOTLINE STATEMENT
WILSONS LEATHER PROTECTOR**

The Commission has received a number of reports that consumers have experienced shortness of breath, coughing and other breathing difficulties following the use of Wilsons Leather Protector, a spray product for the treatment of leather coats and boots. In some cases temporary hospitalization has been required. However, at the present time the Commission is not aware of any permanent injuries or deaths associated with the product.

The Commission is conducting indepth investigations to determine how the product was used in connection with the reported injuries. Samples have been collected and are being analyzed to assure that the product is properly labeled and that it meets all legal requirements. The Commission is working with Wilsons Leather and others to find out specifically why consumers are having adverse reactions to this product.

The company has voluntarily discontinued sale of the product and has withdrawn it from their store shelves. They have also asked consumers to cease using the product and to return it for a full refund. The Commission is monitoring the recall effort to assure its effectiveness. Consumers with additional questions may call the company collect at (612) 541-3561. This withdrawal affects only Wilsons Leather Protector spray and does not affect any other Wilsons leather products.

To reduce exposure to harmful vapors with any aerosol product, consumers should use the product outdoors or with all windows open and active ventilation. Do not spray any aerosol product around your face. Consumers who inhale harmful vapors should call a poison control center or a medical professional for advice.

2 Are Hospitalized, 41 Become Ill After Using New Spray Product

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 27—A poison center said today that two people were hospitalized and 41 others in four states have reported suffering shortness of breath and coughing after using a spray substance made to protect leather.

One person in Portland and one in Colorado were hospitalized but were in good condition, said Marty Smilkstein of the Oregon Health Sciences University's poison center in Portland.

The afflicted people have contacted hospitals in their areas—all in the West—over the past few days, Smilkstein said.

All had reported using a 5-ounce

spray can of Wilsons Leather Protector, which is used to protect coats, boots and other items.

Wilson's officials could not immediately be reached for comment.

Smilkstein said he had contacted Wilsons, and company officials had asked distributors to remove the 5-ounce cans from shelves while the reports were investigated.

The 5-ounce can, unlike a 7-ounce can, is a new product manufactured with a petroleum distillate used as a substitute propellant to replace chlorofluorocarbons, Smilkstein said.

Exposure to any petroleum distillate, such as gasoline fumes, can cause coughing, shortness of breath, headaches and fever.

I spoke to Mr. Paul Tomlinson, Vice President, this afternoon regarding the testing that was being done on the firm's aerosol leather protector. He said the testing has been completed and the various laboratories are now conducting an analysis of the data. He said the written test reports are expected in about two weeks.

The firm is not marketing an aerosol leather protector at the present time, although they are looking at some possible formulations. Mr. Tomlinson said they had received the FOIC letter with comments on the labeling of the recalled product and would take whatever steps were necessary to make sure any new product is properly labeled.

The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) analyzed a sample of leather protector distributed by your firm. Analysis of the product shows that it is not in compliance with the Federal Hazardous Substances Act (FHSA) and the product is a misbranded hazardous substance.

The product is "Wilson's Leather Protector" 5 oz aerosol container. A sample of the leather protector was collected under CPSC sample number R-830-4105 during a December 29, 1992 inspection of your firm by an investigator from our Minneapolis - St. Paul office. The leather protector was tested according to the Method for Determining Extremely Flammable and Flammable Contents of Self-Pressurized Containers, 16 C.F.R. Part 1500.45. A copy of the laboratory test report summary is enclosed. You have been previously given a copy of the FHSA regulations, 16 C.F.R. Parts 1500 to 1512 by our investigator. Also enclosed is a copy of the Compilations of Statutes Administered by CPSC which contains the FHSA.

Our laboratory analysis of the above sample reveals that sample number R-830-4105 exhibited flashback when tested in accordance with 16 C.F.R. Part 1500.45 and had a flash point of -15 degrees F when tested in accordance with 16 C.F.R. Part 1500.43(a). These findings cause the leather protector to meet the definition of "extremely flammable contents of a self-pressurized container" in 16 C.F.R. Part 1500.3(e)(6)(vii) of the FHSA regulations. The product therefore is a "misbranded hazardous substance as defined in 16 C.F.R. Part 1500.3(b)(14) and Section 2(p) of the FHSA because the label lacks the signal word "DANGER" and the affirmative statement of hazard "EXTREMELY FLAMMABLE".

The front or principal display panel for the Wilsons Leather Protector should carry the following minimum warnings: "DANGER - EXTREMELY FLAMMABLE VAPOR MAY BE HARMFUL CONTENTS UNDER PRESSURE Read carefully other cautions on back panel". In addition, the rear panel should carry the additional cautionary statement "Use only in a well ventilated area". The statement "Do Not puncture" should be expanded to "Do not puncture or incinerate container or store above 120 degrees F."

The minimum type sizes to be used on the label depends upon the size of your container's principal display panel. To calculate the area of a principal display panel, please refer to the FHSA regulations at 16 C.F.R. Part 1500.121(c)(1) and the type size requirements at 16 C.F.R. Part 1500.121(c)(2). 16 C.F.R. Part 1500.121 also lists requirements for prominence, placement, and conspicuousness of required cautionary information. If there are separate instruction inserts which are packaged with or which otherwise accompany the product, these warning statements must also be repeated on them.

The distribution of a misbranded hazardous substance is a prohibited act under Section 4 of the FHSA and could result in the Penalties provided under Section 5 of the Act. Please review Chapter 1 of the Regulated Products Handbook (Handbook), a copy of which is enclosed.

It is the Commission staff's understanding that you have stopped sale of the Wilsons Leather Protector and are currently recalling it due to reports and complaints of consumers suffering respiratory distress after using the 5 oz. size. The Commission staff will be monitoring this recall. We request that you correct the label if the current formulation is to be continued and ensure that any similar product be labeled properly.

If you disagree with the Commission staff's finding that the products violate the Commission's regulations, see Chapter 2 of the enclosed Handbook which describes the procedures for presenting your views and any supporting evidence to the staff.

Sections 15 and 37 of the Consumer Product Safety Act contain requirements for the reporting of information regarding certain products you manufacture, import or distribute. Chapter 5 of the Handbook describes the reporting requirements applicable to your firm. Chapter 7 of the Handbook contains information on the confidential treatment of information you submit to the Commission.

On February 11, 1993, I contacted Mr. Paul Tomlinson Vice President-Marketing for Wilson Suede and Leather regarding disposition of recalled aerosol containers of Wilson's Leather Protector.

Mr. Tomlinson said the firm was making arrangements with a private environmental waste disposal company to get a hazardous waste permit so that they could be disposed of in a hazardous waste landfill. He said that some of the leather protector would be kept for possible legal action against the manufacturer of the product. He said all retained containers were being kept in a warehouse in Minneapolis.

Mr. Tomlinson said that the leather protector was discontinued but the firm was negotiating with a manufacturer of a similar product for test marketing in a few of the Wilson's stores. He said a new product line had not been indicated as yet.

INITIAL REPORT OF RECALL AND REQUEST FOR EFFECTIVENESS CHECKS

1. **Reason for Recall:** The formula for the Wilsons Leather Protector was changed and the container size changed from 7 oz. to 5 oz. The firm and state health departments began to receive numerous complaints of chemical pneumonia and respiratory problems from use of the new formula leather protector in the 5 oz. container. The product is also misbranded as the label fails to carry the statement of hazard "EXTREMELY FLAMMABLE".
2. **Type of Program:** This is a voluntary consumer level recall.
3. **Identifying Product Data:** The product is packaged in a black container with white and red lettering and marks with the net weight of the contents at the bottom of the main part of the label. The containers under recall are coded C1192 or C1292. The hazardous ingredient is listed as petroleum distillates. The 7 oz. size labeling is identical except for the net weight and the hazardous ingredient which is listed as 1, 1, 1-trichloroethane.
4. **Corrective Action Plan:** All sales were through over 550 retail stores owned by Wilson Suede and Leather. These stores use the names Wilsons Suede and Leather, Wilson's the Leather Expert, Tannery West, Berman's, Snyder's Leather Outlet, Berman's Leather Outlet and Pelle Ciur. Recall letters and posters were sent to all stores. The letters instruct the stores to pull all stock, both 5 oz. and 7 oz. The firm issued a nationwide press release on its own on December 28, 1992.
5. **Injuries, Deaths, Complaints:** The firm has received over 9,000 telephone calls from consumers. Over 1,000 of the calls involved claims of illness. One death is alleged from use of the product.

6. **Number of Products Involved:** The firm ordered 625,000 of the 5 oz. containers. Approximately 350,000 were sold to consumers with 275,000 unsold and in the firm's distribution system.
7. **Dates of Production:** The new formula leather protector in the 5 oz. size was distributed from late November, 1992 to December 28, 1992.
8. **Mode of Distribution:** All sales were through Wilson owned retail stores.
9. **Geographic Distributors:** Nationwide.
10. **When and How Problem was Discovered:** Firm learned of problem through a telephone call from the Oregon Poison Control Center on December 27, 1992.
11. **Samples:** R-830-4105
12. **Firm's Plan for Disposition of Returned Merchandise:** Returned containers are being stored in a warehouse in Minneapolis, MN. The firm is negotiating to have the returned containers disposed of in a hazardous waste landfill.





"We have pulled both the 5-ounce cans and the old formulation 7-ounce can until we've had a chance to analyze the situation," Tomlinson said. "Only the 5-ounce size is being recalled, but we are removing both sizes from shelves until we have more information."

The company heard Sunday from the Oregon Health Sciences Poison Center in Portland of complaints from customers who said they had suffered shortness of breath or coughing after using the product.

"We've been working with the Portland officials while we investigate the matter," Tomlinson said.

"Until we've completed that investigation we are voluntarily pulling the product from all Wilsons, Bermans, Pelle Cuir, Snyders Leather Outlet, Bermans Leather Outlet and Tannery West stores."

Tomlinson said the directive to remove the product from shelves went out immediately after hearing from Portland officials.

"We will continue to work with officials in Oregon to learn more about the incidents there," Tomlinson said.

Customers should return the product for a full refund, Tomlinson said. In addition, customers with questions may call the company collect at (612) 541-3561.

The Leather Protector product is sprayed on coats, boots and other items to improve the look and performance of the products.

In response to your request for a listing of stores across the country, I've attached an abbreviated store list of Wilsons locations in various states throughout the country.

With regard to the number of Wilsons leather protector five ounce cans that have been returned, we are not able to breakdown the number of five ounce cans due to the fact that both the five ounce and seven ounce cans have the same SKU number and have not been gathered separately. At this time there are 431,958 cans of leather protector awaiting disposal since the initial recall announcement. We estimate that approximately 60% of those cans would be the five ounce spray.





On 1/28/93 I visited the Southern Poison Center, 848 Adams Avenue, Memphis, Tennessee 38103, and met with Dr. Peter Chyka, Executive Director. Dr. Chyka provided me with the names, phone numbers, and case information for 13 individuals who contacted the Southern Poison Center during the Christmas season after experiencing symptoms following exposure to Wilson's Leather Protector (note: Two individuals, D. Adams and K. Adams were the victims during CPSC investigation 930111CCN0667). Dr. Chyka's staff had previously telephoned each individual and obtained their consent to release their name and case information to CPSC.

I discussed the Commission's investigational programs with Dr. Chyka, and emphasized the PPPA Program and elaborated on the undercover pharmacy work I had performed with the cooperation of the Middle Tennessee Poison Center. I explained the Commission's on-going cooperative efforts with poison centers nationwide and the success of these activities and discussed the contraindications possibilities in the future with the Southern Poison Center.

Dr. Chyka asked several questions regarding operational concerns, then stated he would be interested in working with the Consumer Product Safety Commission by referring accidental ingestion cases to us.

Dr. Chyka proceeded to ask some additional questions and agreed to look forward to receiving a phone call from Supervisory Investigator William Gentry on the subject within the next few weeks.

Dr. Chyka generously invited me to look around the center and introduced me to Mr. Gary Bennett of his staff. Mr. Bennett permitted me to sit-in with him while he responded to poison center calls. He demonstrated the use of the micro-medimax software program which is the primary source of toxicological data for telephone referrals, and described how the data is retrieved as the inquiries are received.

Dr. Chyka also introduced me to Dr. James Etteldorf, Special Projects Advisor. Dr. Etteldorf, a retired physician and formerly the Children's Hospital Chief of Staff, volunteers his services to the center for the purpose of providing advice and guidance on poison cases.

Dr. Chyka said the center has approximately 4 full time and 16 part time employees. He said funding is received from the City of Memphis, Shelby County, and the United Way. He said on the average, approximately 18,000-20,000 phone calls are received annually (an average of about 50/day).



Dr. Chyka also shared a verbal description of a recent graduate student project by a University of Tennessee student during which scripts were presented to 50 randomly selected pharmacies in the city for the purpose of making a determination of their level of compliance with the Poison Prevention

Packaging Act requirements regarding CRC's. Results were that 85% were in compliance. He said he would be providing Mr. Gentry an informational copy of the project when it becomes available.

The meeting was concluded.





