6. SYNOPSIS OF INCIDENT A 6 month old female was placed in an infant seat and given a bath by her father in the family tub. He had a monitor in the bathroom with a listening unit in the kitchen. The father stepped away from the bathroom in order to answer the telephone. The bath seat connections came loose from the bottom of the tub and the seat turned on its side with the child's face down in the water. She drowned.

PRE-EVENT

This incident involves the drowning death of a 6 month old girl who was being given a bath in the family tub while sitting in a bath seat. Contacts were limited to local officials in accordance with assignment instructions.

The Medical Examiner, Dr. A.B., reported that the victim weighed 20 pounds and was 28 inches tall. She had a head circumference of 18 inches, a chest circumference of 17 inches, an abdominal circumference of 17 inches and a crown-rump length of 19 inches, see exhibit # 3.

The victim was born on April 13, 1993. She lived with her mother and father, Mr. and Mrs. V, in Phoenix, Arizona. Mr. V was 23 years old while Mrs. V was 21 years old.

This incident took place during the afternoon of October 27, 1993. It was investigated by Phoenix Police Detective P and Detective H. Detective P spoke with the child's parents while Detective H visited the apartment.

Detective H described the victim's home as a two bedroom apartment which faced south. Upon entering the front door you walk into a combination livingroom and kitchen. The northeast corner of the apartment had a full bath with a bedroom in the southeast corner. A second bedroom was in the southwest corner of the apartment with a second bath in the northwest corner.

Mr. V indicated to Detective P that he was home alone with the child while his wife was at work. Around 6:30 p.m. he said that his wife called and she said she was about to leave work.

Mrs. V said that her husband told her that they were out of diapers. She decided that rather than have the child in a wet diaper, her husband might as well give the child her nightly bath.

The mother told Detective P that her daughter liked to play in the water. ~~She told her husband to let the child play in the tub~~ and she would purchase a box of disposable diapers on the way home.

The father decided to give the child a bath in the tub located in the northeast corner of the apartment. A baby monitor was placed on the top of the toilet tank, right next to the tub. Detective H reported that the other end to this monitor was sitting on the counter in the kitchen.

Mr. V filled the tub with water and placed his daughter in an infant bath seat that was secured to the bottom of the tub. The bath seat was examined by Detective H. He reported that this seat had suction cup type connections on the bottom which were used to secure it to the bottom of the bathtub.

He measured the tub and reported that it was 55 inches long and 23 inches wide. Detective H noticed that the water in the tub was about 9 1/2 inches deep at the drain end of the tub and roughly 9 inches deep in the middle area of the tub.

The objects he saw in the tub included the plastic child bath seat, a rubber duck type toy and a rubber fish type toy. A soap dish with a bar of soap on it was on the edge of the tub near the spout. A bottle of baby shampoo was at the other end of the tub. There was a shower curtain hanging at the spout end of the tub with the end of the curtain in the water.

The father told Officer T and Detective P that his daughter was in the tub for about 25 - 30 minutes. During that time he left the room about three times in order to answer the telephone.

The last telephone call came at about 7:05 p.m. The father left his daughter in the tub, walked into the livingroom and answered the telephone. The call was from a phone solicitor about portraits.

The exact sequence of events which occurred in the bathroom are unknown. Mr. V told Detective P that the suction cups on the bottom of the bath seat apparently let go. The seat tipped over to the side causing his daughter to go face down into the water while she was still in the chair.

EVENT

The victim's face became submerged in the bath water.

POST-EVENT

According to Detective H, the telephone used by Mr. V was located on an old chest up against the north end of the east wall in the livingroom. The telephone had an eight foot cord.

Detective H estimated that the distance between the telephone and the bath tub in which the victim was sitting measured about 13 feet. He reported that there was a clear line of sight from the area of the telephone into the bathroom where the child was sitting.

Mr. V indicated to the Police Officers that the telephone call from the person selling portraits lasted about two minutes.

After the call he returned to the bathroom and found his daughter floating face down in the water. The bath seat was no longer connected to the bottom of the tub. It was floating on its side and the child's face was in the water.

He pulled her from the tub, went into the livingroom and called 9-1-1 for medical assistance. Mr. V placed the child on the floor and attempted to perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR).

Officer T and Officer V were the first emergency units to arrive on the scene. They entered the apartment around 7:10 p.m.

The Officers noticed that a clear, slightly blood tinged fluid, was around the child's mouth. She was pale and motionless. Officer V began mouth to mouth respirations while Officer T performed chest compressions. Fire department paramedics arrived about two minutes later and took over CPR activities.

The child was transported by air to St. Joseph's Hospital in critical condition. She was admitted to the Pediatric Intensive Care Unit.

Detective H went to the apartment and met with Officer T and Officer V while Detective P interviewed the child's parents at the hospital.

The Police Officers indicated that the general condition of the apartment was messy with clothing and things on the floor in all the rooms.

While in the apartment the Officers and Detective H checked the effectiveness of the monitoring device. They splashed the water in the tub and established that the monitor was in working order.

Detective H examined the tub and reported that the plastic baby seat was floating in the water near the spout end of the tub. He indicated that if the baby was sitting in the seat she would have been facing the foot of the tub, away from the spout.

Officer B arrived at the scene and took snap shots (polaroids) of the bathtub and the bath seat.

The child died two days later. She was pronounced dead by Dr. T on 10-29-93 at 6:30 p.m.

The child's body was examined by a Maricopa County Medical Examiner, Dr. A.B. She conducted an autopsy and determined that the child's death was due to drowning. Her pathologic diagnoses included:

1. Drowning.
2. Status post cardiopulmonary resuscitation.
 - A. Ascites.
 - B. scalp abrasion.
 - C. Left lung cyst.
 - D. Cerebral edema.
 - E. Subendocardial myocardial infarct.

A copy of the Medial Examiner's autopsy report is attached as exhibit # 3.

Copies of the Police reports are attached as exhibit # 3. I spoke with Phoenix Police Records personnel and Detective P about this incident and the police polaroids/snap shots.

Detective P said that they did not collect/impound the baby bath seat involved in this death. It was left with the child's parents.

Police records personnel stated that they do not keep copies of snap shots/polaroids like the ones taken by a field officer in this case. Detective P feels that these snap shots may no longer be available since their investigation into this death took place over three years ago. He agreed to check and let me know if they locate these polaroids.

PRODUCT IDENTIFICATION

The bath seat involved in this incident was identified by Detective H as carrying the name Gerry Baby Products - The Huffy Company. Gerry Baby Products is located in Boulder, Colorado.

Detective H indicated that there were two caution statements on this bath seat. They included:

TO PREVENT DROWNING NEVER LEAVE CHILD UNATTENDED

THIS PRODUCT IS ONLY FOR USE WITH CHILDREN THAT
ARE CAPABLE OF SITTING UPRIGHT UNATTENDED

Detective H reported that the baby monitor located in the bathroom also carried the brand name "Gerry".

This incident took place in a bathtub which measured 55 inches long by 23 inches wide. No brand name or manufacturer information was available.

No further information was available.

PHOENIX POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT

ORIGINAL

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1950 HOURS, AT WHICH TIME I CONTACTED MEDICAL STAFF AND OBTAINED INFORMATION ON THE PATIENT. I WAS TOLD E.R. PERSONNEL WERE PRESENTLY ADMINISTERING CPR.

SGT. LANE ARRIVED AND SHORTLY THEREAFTER PATROL OFFICER TULCHINSKY #5034. OFFICER TULCHINSKY WAS ONE OF THE FIRST OFFICERS ARRIVING AT THE SCENE OF THIS INCIDENT LOCATED AT [REDACTED] BLVD, APARTMENT 1116. HE BRIEFED US CONCERNING THE INFORMATION KNOWN THUS FAR IN THIS INVESTIGATION.

OFFICER TULCHINSKY INFORMED US THE INFANT, [REDACTED] AGE 6 MONTHS WAS HOME WITH HER FATHER [REDACTED] AT AROUND 1830 HOURS, AFTER TALKING WITH HIS WIFE ON THE TELEPHONE, [REDACTED] ED [REDACTED] IN THE BATHTUB. SHE WAS IN THE TUB FOR APPROXIMATELY 25 MINUTES DURING WHICH TIME [REDACTED] WOULD LEAVE THE BATHROOM FROM TIME TO TIME AND RETURN TO CHECK ON HER WELFARE.

DURING THAT TIME, AT APPROXIMATELY 1905 HOURS [REDACTED] RECEIVED A TELEPHONE CALL FROM A PHONE SOLICITOR. WHEN HE HUNG UP THE TELEPHONE, HE WENT INTO THE BATHROOM TO CHECK ON HIS KAYSIA. HE DISCOVERED HER FLOATING FACE DOWN IN THE WATER IN THE BATHTUB. EDWARD PULLED HER FROM THE TUB AND CALLED 911 REQUESTING EMERGENCY MEDICAL ASSISTANCE. OFFICER TULCHINSKY AND OFFICER VATH #4685 WERE THE FIRST EMERGENCY UNITS TO ARRIVE ON THE SCENE, AT APPROXIMATELY 1910 HOURS. THEY IMMEDIATELY INITIATED CPR, ATTEMPTING TO REVIVE THE CHILD, WHO WAS UNCONSCIOUS AND UNRESPONSIVE. APPROXIMATELY TWO MINUTES LATER PHOENIX FIRE PARAMEDIC UNITS ARRIVED ON THE SCENE AND TOOK OVER THE CPR RESPONSIBILITIES FROM THE OFFICERS.

AT THE COMPLETION OF OFFICER TULCHINSKY'S BRIEFING, I CONTACTED EDWARD AND AMY [REDACTED] THE PARENTS OF [REDACTED] I SPOKE WITH THEM IN THE FAMILY QUIET ROOM ADJACENT TO THE EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT. AT THAT TIME I INTERVIEWED THEM CONCERNING THEIR KNOWLEDGE OF THIS INCIDENT.

[REDACTED] INFORMED ME HE WAS HOME ALONE TAKING CARE OF HIS INFANT DAUGHTER WHILE HIS WIFE WORKED. AT APPROXIMATELY 6:30 PM, HE RECEIVED A TELEPHONE CALL FROM HIS WIFE, AS SHE WAS PREPARING TO LEAVE WORK. DURING THE CONVERSATION AMY TOLD EDWARD TO PLACE KAYSIA IN THE BATHTUB FOR HER NIGHTLY BATH. WHEN HE FINISHED HIS CONVERSATION WITH HIS WIFE, EDWARD PLACED KAYSIA IN THE BATHTUB. AFTERWARD HE TOOK THE BABY MONITOR INTO THE BATHROOM TO MONITOR [REDACTED] WHEN HE WAS NOT IN THE ROOM.

DURING THE NEXT THIRTY MINUTES EDWARD LEFT THE BATHROOM FROM TIME TO TIME. HE ALSO RECEIVED THREE TELEPHONE CALLS. THE LAST CALL WAS FROM A TELEPHONE SOLICITOR AND THE DURATION OF THE CALL WAS APPROXIMATELY TWO MINUTES. AFTERWARDS EDWARD TERMINATED THE CALL THEN WENT INTO THE BATHROOM TO DISCOVER KAYSIA FACE DOWN IN THE WATER. EDWARD IMMEDIATELY PULLED HER FROM THE WATER AND WENT TO THE TELEPHONE TO DIAL 911.

EDWARD CLAIMS WHILE MAKING THE 911 CALL, HE WAS INITIALLY PLACED ON HOLD BRIEFLY BEFORE BEING CONNECTED TO AN OPERATOR. WHEN HE TOLD THEM OF HIS DAUGHTER'S PROBLEM THE PERSON ON THE LINE ATTEMPTED TO GIVE HIM DETAILS ON ADMINISTERING CPR. EDWARD WAS CRITICAL OF THE INDIVIDUAL HE SPOKE WITH, STATING HE FELT HE WAS NOT ADEQUATELY INSTRUCTING HIM ON WHAT TO DO UNDER

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THE CIRCUMSTANCES.

EDWARD HAD BY THIS TIME PLACED KAYSIA ON THE FLOOR AND WAS ATTEMPTING TO ADMINISTER CPR TO HER WHEN TWO UNIFORMED POLICE OFFICERS ARRIVED AT HIS APARTMENT. THE OFFICERS BEGAN CPR AND CONTINUED THE PROCEDURE FOR SEVERAL MINUTES BEFORE THE FIRE PARAMEDICS ARRIVED AT HIS APARTMENT.

I SPOKE BRIEFLY WITH AMY VINSON, WHO INFORMED ME SHE WAS AT WORK AT THE POSEY POST FLOWER SHOP LOCATED AT [REDACTED] STREET IN SCOTTSDALE. SHE TELEPHONED HER HUSBAND AT APPROXIMATELY 1830 HOURS TO INFORM HIM SHE WAS GETTING READY TO LEAVE WORK. AT THAT TIME EDWARD TOLD HER THEY WERE OUT OF DIAPERS. RATHER THAN HAVE HER DAUGHTER SIT AROUND IN A WET DIAPER, AMY INSTRUCTED EDWARD TO PUT THE BABY IN THE BATHTUB FOR HER NIGHTLY BATH AND LET HER PLAY FOR A WHILE. SHE ADDED THE BABY LIKES WATER VERY WELL. AMY THEN LEFT WORK ENROUTE HOME. ON HER WAY SHE STOPPED OFF AT A STORE AND PURCHASED A BOX OF PAMPERS DISPOSABLE DIAPERS. WHEN AMY ARRIVED AT HER APARTMENT SEVERAL EMERGENCY UNITS WERE THERE.

AFTER SPEAKING WITH THE PARENTS OF [REDACTED] I SPOKE WITH THE ATTENDING PEDIATRIC PHYSICIAN TREATING KAYSIA, NAMED PAT [REDACTED] M.D. DR. TEAFORD INFORMED ME THAT THE PATIENT WAS IN EXTREMELY GRAVE CONDITION. DR. TEAFORD DID NOT EXPECT THE PATIENT TO SURVIVE THIS INCIDENT, ADDING IF SHE SHOULD SURVIVE SHE WOULD HAVE SEVERE BRAIN DAMAGE.

I SECURED FROM THE HOSPITAL AT APPROXIMATELY 2230 HOURS AND RETURNED TO 620 WEST WASHINGTON FOR FOLLOW-UP ON THIS INVESTIGATION. WHILE AT 620, I CONFERRED WITH DET. HUTCHENS WHO HAD THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE SCENE INVESTIGATION. I EXAMINED SEVERAL POLAROID PHOTOGRAPHS TAKEN OF THE BATHROOM, SPECIFICALLY THE BATHTUB WHERE KAYSIA HAD NEARLY DROWNED. I NOTICED AN INFANT CHAIR IN THE WATER. DET. HUTCHENS INFORMED ME THE CHAIR HAS SUCTION CUPS ON THE BOTTOM OF IT TO BE USED TO SECURE IT TO THE BOTTOM OF THE BATHTUB. WHEN I FIRST SPOKE WITH EDWARD VINSON THERE WAS NO MENTION OF THE CHILD SEAT.

I RETURNED TO ST. JOSEPH'S HOSPITAL IN ORDER TO RE-CONTACT [REDACTED] AND CLARIFY IF THE CHILD WAS IN THE INFANT SEAT THE TIME OF THIS INCIDENT. EDWARD TOLD ME HE HAD PLACED KAYSIA IN THE INFANT SEAT. WHEN HE DISCOVERED HER IN THE BATHTUB THE SUCTION CUPS HOLDING THE CHAIR IN PLACE HAD APPARENTLY "LET GO". NOTE: This investigation involved a drowning incident in a bathtub. Information in his report was provided by investigating medical and police officials. Contact with the victim's next-of-kin was not permitted.

PRE-ACCIDENT

On the afternoon of July 4, 1997, the victim was at home with her mother. The victim is described as a 7 month old female, approximately 69.0 centimeters tall, and weighing about 9,185 grams. Reportedly, she was in good health, but at the time of the incident she had a cold.

The victim's mother had gotten off work at 4:00 a.m. She went to the ~~baby-sitter's~~ house, and then she and the victim went home. She and the victim went to sleep, and awoke at 1:30 p.m. After feeding the victim, the mother filled the bathtub with water. She put the product, a baby bathtub seat/ring, into the tub, and secured it to the tub with the suction cups on the bottom of the product. She put the victim inside the product.

She left the victim unattended in the bathroom area while she went to the kitchen to boil water to fix baby bottles. When the victim's mother returned to the bathroom she found the victim still in the product but in a different position.

ACCIDENT

Reportedly, the victim slipped through the product, and was lying on her side with her head partially submerged in the water in the bathtub.

POST ACCIDENT

The victim's mother removed the top part of the product from the bottom part that had suction cups attached, and took the victim out of the product. She took the victim into her bedroom where she began mouth to mouth resuscitation. She called 911, and emergency officials transported the victim to the hospital. Resuscitation efforts were unsuccessful, and the victim died as a result of respiratory insufficiency secondary to immersion in water (drowning).

According to the police report, included as Attachment 1, investigating police officials on the scene took measurements of the water in the bathtub. Reportedly, the water in one end of the tub measured 5", the middle section where the product was located measured 4 1/2", and the other end of the tub measured 4".

Investigating medical officials interviewed the victim's mother who reported that the victim had begun pulling herself up on objects, and was able to hold herself upright. The victim's mother reported that when she left the victim, she was sitting upright in the product with her legs out of the appropriate openings. When she

returned to the bathroom, the victim had slid down into one opening, and both legs were through the same opening. The victim was on her right side with the right arm sticking through another section of the product with her head lying to the side and partially submerged in the water. The coroner's report, and autopsy report are included as Attachment 2.

Photographs of the bathroom area, bathtub and the product are included as Attachment 3.

Per the assignment message, contact with the next-of-kin was not permitted.

PRODUCT INFORMATION

The first product is identified as a baby bathtub seat/ring. Investigating officials describe the product as round, and made of heavy plastic material. The product has suction cups on the bottom that secure it to the bottom of the bathtub. There are two leg openings, and a ring on the top portion of the product for the child to hold onto, and some colored beads for the child to play with. Identifying information on the product reported by investigating police officials includes "Made in USA, Copyright 1989, UK Road 1990 2006813 Canada Road, 1990 Safety 1ST, Inc., All rights reserved, US Pat. 5010606 and 5158460". Labeling on the product includes the message "Warning, Prevent Drowning, Do not leave child unattended in the tub".

The second product is identified as a bathtub. No other identifying information is available.

BRIEF HISTORY: This history was provided by Spartanburg County Coroner's Investigator, Mr. Randy Smith. According to Mr. Smith, this 7 month old black female infant was reportedly left unattended in a bathtub by her mother. She was supposedly in some type of play apparatus and when the mother returned, the infant was unresponsive with frothy fluid coming from the nose and mouth. Resuscitation attempts were unsuccessful.

DESCRIPTION OF CLOTHING: The decedent is unclothed. There is an IV in place in the right facial region, and an orotracheal tube is taped in place in the mouth. EKG patches are present on the upper chest bilaterally and the left lateral flank region.

EXTERNAL DESCRIPTION: This is the body of a well developed, well nourished black female infant appearing stated age with a crown-heel length of 69.0 centimeters, crown-rump length 48.0 centimeters, chest circumference 43.4 centimeters, and head circumference 44.7 centimeters. The approximate weight is 9,185 grams. There is mild fixed rigor mortis of the extremities, and there is posterior minimally blanching livor mortis with pressure blanching about the hips and upper posterior back. The decedent has a full head of short curly black hair with no palpable skull trauma or asymmetry with the anterior fontanel soft. Inspection of the eyes reveal the irides to be dark brown in color with the pupils bilaterally fixed to 3.0 millimeters with pale sclerae and with a single pinpoint petechial hemorrhage along the lateral-lower right lid. The nose and ears are unremarkable. Inspection of the mouth reveals the lower two front central incisors to be recently erupted, and there are no mucosal lesions with drying artifact of the external lip. The neck is unremarkable. Inspection of the chest and abdomen reveals no obvious injuries to be present with very slight umbilical hernia and with the abdomen tense. The decedent has normal female infant genitalia. The back is unremarkable. Inspection of the upper and lower extremities reveals an attempted IV puncture wound present along the right anterior ankle region.

INTERNAL DESCRIPTION: The body is opened with a standard crutch shaped incision to reveal no injuries to the soft tissues of the thorax, abdomen, or strap muscles of the

neck with the hyoid bone intact. Removal of the chest plate reveals the visceral organs to appear edematous and congested with no excess accumulations of fluid within respective body cavities. The lungs have a bilateral dark blue meaty appearance. There are very focal petechial hemorrhages of the thymus gland and epicardium.

DESCRIPTION OF ORGAN SYSTEMS

THYROID: The thyroid weighs only approximately 3 grams with homogeneous brownish tan granular cut surfaces with a small 0.5 centimeter diameter lymph node visible on the inferior border of the left lobe.

THYMUS: The thymus gland is grossly enlarged weighing 62 grams with focal petechial hemorrhages on the otherwise congested pinkish tan surfaces. Sectioning reveals similar congestion but no masses.

CARDIOVASCULAR SYSTEM: The heart is mildly dilated weighing 53 grams with coronary arteries arising in their normal location. Valves and valve cusps appear normal with no septal defects noted. Sectioning of the myocardium reveals congested cut surfaces without abnormalities. The aorta is unremarkable with the ductus arteriosus closed.

RESPIRATORY SYSTEM: There is a small amount of liquid clear fluid remaining within the trachea and peripheral bronchi bilaterally. The right and left lungs weigh 86 and 65 grams, respectively, with very little aerated spaces visible with otherwise dark blue firm meaty pleural surfaces. Sectioning reveals similar dark blue congested cut surfaces with the majority of the lung sinking when immersed in formalin. No masses are present.

GASTROINTESTINAL SYSTEM: The esophagus is unremarkable. The stomach contains less than 2 ounces of reddish brown granular appearing material admixed with watery fluid with a very slight fruity odor. No lesions are identified. The remainder of the GI tract appears to be within normal limits with the appendix present.

LIVER AND GALLBLADDER: The liver has a smooth brownish tan across weighing 425 grams. Sectioning reveals no masses to be present. The gallbladder contains less than 5 cc's of greenish bile without mucosal lesions.

PANCREAS: There appears to be agonal congestion of the pancreas which weighs approximately 10 grams with no masses on sectioning.

SPLEEN: The spleen has a tense dark blue capsule weighing 45 grams with small easily discernible Malpighian corpuscles on sectioning.

ADRENAL GLANDS: Collectively, the adrenal glands weigh less than 4 grams with normal appearing cut surfaces.

URINARY SYSTEM: The right and left kidneys weigh 30 and 32 grams, respectively, with easily strippable capsules, persistent fetal lobulations, and congested smooth cortical surfaces. There is congestion on sectioning but no masses. The ureters are unremarkable. The bladder contains no appreciable urine with no mucosal lesions.

INTERNAL GENITALIA: Normal female infant except there are small serous filled cysts within the ovaries bilaterally each less than 0.5 centimeters in diameter.

LYMPHOID SYSTEM AND BONE MARROW: There are prominent lymph nodes within the mesentery as well as the described possible lymph node in the left subthyroid region. No other lymph nodes are identified. The bone marrow is unremarkable.

CENTRAL NERVOUS SYSTEM: Reflection of the scalp reveals no hemorrhages or contusions with focal mildly congested soft tissue. The calvarium is intact. There are no epidural, subdural, or subarachnoid hemorrhages with no vascular lesions or aneurysms noted. There does appear to be focal very mild subarachnoid congestion. The brain weighs 900 grams with no masses on sectioning.

EXAMINATION OF EYES: The eyes are enucleated and examined for retinal hemorrhages with no hemorrhages identified.

SPECIAL STUDIES: Blood was removed for toxicology screen with brain and liver tissue sampled and frozen. Vitreous humor was also saved for possible reference, if necessary.

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FINAL SUMMARY: This autopsy was done at the request of and after due authorization of the Spartanburg County Coroner's Office in the SRMC Autopsy Room on 7/5/97 beginning at approximately 8:00AM.

Postmortem examination and autopsy of the body of Yasmine K. Gist, 7 month old black female, revealed no external or internal injuries to be present. The only findings at autopsy of significance were a single petechial hemorrhage of the right lower eyelid, very mild petechial hemorrhages of the thymus and epicardium, and severely congested heavy boggy lungs bilaterally which did not float when immersed in formalin. At autopsy, no significant disease processes could be identified grossly. Body fluids removed at autopsy were forwarded to the Coroner for toxicological examination.

Based on the history and autopsy findings as stated in this protocol, it is my opinion that this individual died as the result of respiratory insufficiency secondary to immersion in water (drowning). The manner of death is under investigation by the Coroner's Office.

FINAL NECROPSY DIAGNOSES

- 1) Bilateral acute aspiration of watery into peripheral lungs and stomach, mild grossly.
- 2) Bilateral severely congested boggy lungs with acute intra-alveolar hemorrhage.
- 3) Petechial hemorrhage of right lower eyelid and mild petechial hemorrhages of thymus and epicardium of heart.
- 4) Visceral congestion, generalized.
- 5) Patchy subarachnoid congestion of brain.

SUMMARY

Apparently, a healthy, active 9 month old male drowned in a bathtub at his home after he was able to climb out of a bathseat. Police report states that the mother said that the bathtub was filled full and the victim was placed in the seat inside the tub. The report indicates that the mother then left the bathroom to do some other things, and that she returned to the bathroom about 5 minutes later to find the victim out of the seat and lying on his side in the tub of water. The report indicates that the mother removed the victim from the bathtub and carried him to the living room. The report indicates that she called 911 and began CPR. Report indicates that Emergency Medical Personnel continued CPR and transported the victim to Huntington Memorial Hospital, where he was pronounced dead.

PRODUCT IDENTIFICATION

Police report indicates that there was no brand name on the bathseat but that it did have a warning label stating "DROWNING MAY OCCUR IF CHILD IS LEFT UNATTENDED." Police Captain Shane Bickel said that he thought that the seat also bore an embossed label "Safety 1st", but he wasn't sure. Police personnel also photographed the seat using a digital camera. Capt. Bickel said that the photographs were not available at the time of this visit due to an equipment problem, but would be available within "a few days". Copies of those photos have been requested. Capt. Bickel said that the seat was equipped with "suction cups" which held the seat to the tub. He said that the seat was upright at the accident scene and that the suction cups apparently performed properly in that they did not separate from the seat and also adhered firmly to the bottom of the tub. He said that a police officer had to slide the seat "up the back of the tub" to remove the seat from the tub. At the time of this investigation, the bathseat was in the possession of the Huntington County (IN) Coroner. Coroner was not in his office during visits on two consecutive days. His staff declined to permit this investigator to view and photograph the bathseat in the coroners absence.

The victims' mother said that she wasn't sure where the seat had been purchased but thought that it was gotten at a Wal-mart store or a Target store.
