Subject: Phone response to a letter referred to CPSC from Hillary Rodham Clinton relating to warning stickers for poisonous household products.

Background

In a letter dated January 4, 1996 to Hillary Rodham Clinton, Constance Healey expressed her concern for promoting child safety in the home. Motivated by an incident of near poisoning to one of her children, Ms. Healey developed "Safe House Stickers" to apply to poisonous household products. The stickers are designed to warn children that the product is dangerous while it is in use or out of a locked cabinet. Ms. Healey is interested in finding a way to distribute her product and inquired if there was a possibility that her stickers be included in the Baby Safety Shower Kit or any other appropriate program.

Phone Call

I spoke to Constance Healey on 2/20/96 and thanked her for her letter and interest in child safety. However, I told her that the Baby Safety Shower Program was finalized and that it would not be possible to include her stickers in the kit. I suggested that she contact the American Association of Poison Control Centers about distributing her product. I also referred her to Nancy Sachs, a key organizer of the Baby Safety Shower, if she had additional questions about the program.
