Dear Mr. Small:

Thank you for your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request seeking information from the Commission. The records from the Commission files responsive to your request have been processed and copies of the releasable responsive records are enclosed. The enclosed records include file information generated by the Commission itself or its contractors for regulatory or enforcement purposes. These records are from law enforcement investigatory file designated CA970108 and include hazard assessment memoranda, correspondence, notes and documents. The Commission has established management systems under which supervisors are responsible for reviewing the work of their employees or contractors. The file information materials are final and have been prepared and accepted by the Commission's staff under such review systems. The Commission believes that it has taken reasonable steps to assure the accuracy of the information. Please note that the Commission's staff, not the Commissioners themselves, made the preliminary determination that this product presented a substantial risk of injury to the public as defined by the Consumer Product Safety Act (CPSA).

The enclosed records include Epidemiologic Investigation Reports (within file CA970108) with the underlying and supporting documentation. The Commission has received this information from its formal investigation systems. Through these systems the Commission hopes to learn when specific products are associated with illness, injury or death. The Commission believes that it has taken reasonable steps to assure the accuracy of this information. While conducting the interviews for the investigation reports, Commission staff or contractors have spoken with the individuals involved or with others who witnessed or are familiar with the

incidents. Where possible, Commission staff have examined the products reportedly involved in the incidents. Although the Commission has investigated the incidents described in the investigation reports, the Commission has not necessarily determined the cause of the incidents.

Also enclosed are records pertaining to product complaints and reported incidents (within the file CA970108) that were submitted to the Commission by consumers and others. The consumers or submitters have confirmed the accuracy of the information in the complaints and reported incidents. The Commission has neither investigated the incidents nor conducted or obtained any evaluations of the products that corroborate the substance of the information contained in the complaints and reported incidents. In some of the complaints and reported incidents we have removed the identities of the complainants at their request.

We must withhold certain portions of the records contained in the Commission's active law enforcement investigatory files that were submitted by the manufacturer and considered to be proprietary and confidential information. We are withholding the records pursuant to the Exemptions 3, 4, 5, and 7(E), 5 U.S.C. §§ 552(b)(3), (b)(4), (b)(5), and (b)(7)(E), and sections 6(a)(2) and 25(c) of the CPSA, 15 U.S.C. §§ 2055(a)(2), and 2074(c).

FOIA Exemption 3 provides for the withholding from disclosure of matters that are specifically exempted from disclosure by another statute. In applying FOIA Exemption 3 to these records, we are relying in part on section on CPSA section 6(a)(2) to withhold files that contain proprietary and confidential information. We must withhold pursuant to Exemptions 3 and 4 and section 6(a)(2) of the CPSA. Section 6(a)(2) prohibits the Commission from disclosing information that is exempt from disclosure under Exemption 4 of the FOIA. That exemption protects trade secrets and confidential commercial information directly related to a firm's business that the firm has not made public and whose disclosure could give a substantial commercial advantage to a competitor. The protected records include sales information, customer lists, and engineering design information at pages 42-49, 123-152 and 210-229).

Certain internal staff notes and memoranda, including a preliminary determination sheet, are also being withheld pursuant to FOIA Exemptions 5, and 7(E). Exemption 5 provides for the withholding from disclosure of inter-agency and intra-agency memoranda which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency. Exemption 7(E) provides for the withholding from disclosure records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law. The staff memoranda and analyses being withheld are both predecisional and deliberative, consisting of recommendations, opinions, suggestions and analyses. Any factual materials in the memoranda and notes not covered by some other exemption are inextricably intertwined with exempt materials or the disclosure of the factual materials would itself expose the deliberative process. We have determined that the disclosure of the law enforcement investigatory records responsive to your request would be contrary to the public interest. It would not be in the public interest to disclose these materials because disclosure would (1) impair the frank exchange of views necessary with respect to such matters, and (2) reveal the techniques, guidelines and strategies

utilized by the investigative and legal staff in developing the information regarding this investigation and other on-going investigations, which if disclosed would significantly risk circumvention of the statutes and regulations that the Commission administers.

You will note that in the documents disclosed information that could identify injured parties has been deleted, because section 25(c) of the CPSA, 15 U.S.C. § 2074(c)(1), prohibits such disclosures without the consent of those individuals. In some cases the parties have denied consent or consent has not otherwise been obtained.

According to the Commission's regulations implementing the FOIA at 16 C.F.R. § 1015.7, a partial denial of access to records may be appealed to the General Counsel of the Commission within thirty (30) days of your receipt of this letter. An appeal must be in writing and addressed to: FOIA APPEAL, General Counsel, ATTN: Office of the Secretary, U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, Washington, D. C. 20207.

The Commission's FOIA regulations at 16 C.F.R. § 1015.9, provide for the charging of fees resulting from the processing of FOIA requests. The processing of your request involved:

- (1) the duplication of 600 pages X \$0.10/page = \$60.00;
- (2) file searching by professional personnel, 1 hour X \$19.60/hour = \$19.60; and
- (3) review time to determine whether records were permitted to be withheld, 0.5 hours X \$19.60/hour = \$9.80. Forward the total amount due, **\$89.40**, by check or money order (**with your Tax Identification Number (TIN)**) made payable to the **TREASURY OF THE UNITED STATES** with the enclosed copy of this letter to: **Division of Financial Services, ADFS Room 522, U.S. CONSUMER PRODUCT SAFETY COMMISSION, Washington, D. C. 20207.** You must include your **Tax Identification Number (TIN)** with your payment.

Note that after thirty days interest will be charged on amounts billed. Furthermore, if billing is not paid in a timely manner the Commission will require advance payment for your future requests and any pending requests.

The Commission's Freedom of Information Officer, Office of the Secretary, will consider written request for a waiver of the assessed fees when the requester can show that disclosure of the requested information is in the public interest because it is likely to contribute significantly to public understanding of the operations or activities of the government and disclosure of the requested information is not primarily in the commercial interest of the requester. Other factors to be considered are listed in the regulations at 16 C.F.R. § 1015.9(f)(5).

Thank you for your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request seeking information from the Commission. The records from the Commission files responsive to your request have been processed and copies of the releasable responsive records are enclosed.

The enclosed records include file information generated by the Commission itself or its contractors for regulatory or enforcement purposes. These records are in file CPSC CA 970108 (Tara Toy Corporation, Flying Warrior Doll) and are identified as Establishment Inspection Reports, Laboratory Summaries, Hazard Assessment memoranda, Preliminary Determination Sheet and other correspondence, notes and documents. The Commission has established management systems under which supervisors are responsible for reviewing the work of their employees or contractors. The file information materials are final and have been prepared and accepted by the Commission's staff under such review systems. The Commission believes that it has taken reasonable steps to assure the accuracy of the information. Please note that the Commission's staff, not the Commissioners themselves, made the preliminary determination that this product presented a substantial risk of injury to the public as defined by the Consumer Product Safety Act.

Portions of the files where the manufacturer has requested confidentiality must be withheld pursuant to Exemptions 3 and 4 of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. " 552(b)(3) and (b)(4), and section 6(a)(2) of the Consumer Product Safety Act (CPSA), 15 U.S.C. ' 2055(a)(2). FOIA Exemption 3 provides for the withholding from disclosure of matters that are specifically exempted from disclosure by another statute. In applying FOIA Exemption 3 in this instance we are applying in part section 6(a)(2) of the CPSA. Section 6(a)(2) prohibits the Commission from disclosing information that is exempt from disclosure under Exemption 4 of

the FOIA. That exemption protects trade secrets and confidential commercial information. Confidential commercial information is information directly related to a firm's business that the firm has not made public and whose disclosure could give a substantial commercial advantage to a competitor. Specifically, we are withholding portions that if disclosed would reveal engineering drawings (pages 132 through 152, and customer lists and unit pricing (pages 42 through 49; 210 through 229).

We must withhold portions of this law enforcement investigatory file (designated CA970108) pursuant to the Exemptions 5 and 7(E) of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. §§ 552(b)(5) and (b)(7)(E). Exemption 5 provides for the withholding from disclosure of inter-agency and intra-agency memoranda which would not be available by law to a party in litigation with the agency. FOIA Exemption 7(E) provides for the withholding from disclosure records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law.

The records being withheld consist of internal notes and memoranda containing recommendations, opinions, suggestions and analyses of the Commission's technical and legal staffs. The records constitute both predecisional and deliberative discussion that clearly falls within the attorney-client and attorney-work product privileges. Any factual materials in the records not covered by some other exemption are inextricably intertwined with exempt materials or the disclosure of the factual materials would itself expose the deliberative process. We have determined that the disclosure of these certain law enforcement investigatory records responsive to your request would be contrary to the public interest. It would not be in the public interest to disclose these materials because disclosure would (1) impair the frank exchange of views necessary with respect to such matters, and (2) reveal the techniques, guidelines and strategies utilized by the investigative and legal staff in developing the information regarding this investigation and other on-going investigations, which if disclosed would significantly risk circumvention of the statutes and regulations that the Commission administers.

Also enclosed are records that pertain to two (2) Epidemiologic (In-Depth) Investigation Reports with the underlying and supporting documentation and related product complaints or reported incidents where available. The Commission has received this information from its formal investigation systems. Through these systems the Commission hopes to learn when specific products are associated with illness, injury or death. The Commission believes that it has taken reasonable steps to assure the accuracy of this information. While conducting the interviews for the investigation reports, Commission staff or contractors have spoken with the individuals involved or with others who

witnessed or are familiar with the incidents. Where possible, Commission staff have examined the products reportedly involved in the incidents. Although the Commission has investigated the incidents described in the investigation reports, the Commission has not necessarily determined the cause of the incidents.

Finally, we are enclosing four (4) product complaints and reported incidents that were submitted to the Commission by consumers and others. The consumers or submitters have confirmed the accuracy of the information in the complaints and reported incidents. The Commission has neither investigated the incidents nor conducted or obtained any evaluations of the products that corroborate the substance of the information contained in the complaints and reported incidents.

According to the Commission's regulations implementing the FOIA at 16 C.F.R. § 1015.7, a partial denial of access to records may be appealed to the General Counsel of the Commission within thirty (30) days of your receipt of this letter. An appeal must be in writing and addressed to: FOIA APPEAL, General Counsel, ATTN: Office of the Secretary, U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, Washington, D. C. 20207.




Dear Jean:

It was a pleasure to speak with you again yesterday. As we discussed, it appears that Wal-Mart did not carry this particular toy. Our buyer, Fran Craven, indicated that he had not purchased this item from the manufacturer, Tara. You asked whether stores had individually purchased it. While that is possible, in order to confirm that, I would need specific purchase order information from the manufacturer in order to begin to research it. In any event, there does not seem to be a chain wide purchase from the corporate level.

If you determine that Wal-Mart did indeed carry the toy in isolated locations, we, of course, will cooperate in the notice and recall process established by the CPSC and the manufacturer.



CPSC, Tara Toy Corp. Announce Recall of Flying Dolls

WASHINGTON, D.C. - In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Tara Toy Corp. of Hauppauge, N.Y., is voluntarily recalling about 670,000 Flying Warrior dolls. During use, the wings of these flying dolls can break off, causing serious injuries to consumers.

CPSC and Tara Toy Corp. have received four reports of the doll's wing breaking off during use. Two children suffered serious eye injuries, including a shattered iris and cataract development that required an artificial lens, and resulted in partial loss of sight. A cut under the eye and a broken front tooth also have resulted.

The Flying Warrior dolls, measuring about 7 inches tall, are made of colored and metallic plastic. There are four warriors: "Rotor," "Blades," "Gyro" and "Spin." The warriors have plastic metallic bodies with green, blue, red, and yellow uniform accents. Their arms are attached to yellow or red wings with accent colors. The warriors are placed on launchers, which have a pull cord to release the doll into the air. The launchers also have a foam missile that can be released into the air. The words, "Made in China" are embossed onto the back of the warrior's leg. "Tara Toy Corp...Made in China" is embossed on the launcher.


The dolls are packaged in colorful cardboard window boxes. "Flying Warriors...Tara" is printed on the front of the box.

Toy stores nationwide sold the dolls from April 1995 through December 1997 for about \$7.

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
