Boy, 10, killed by pellet gun fired by friend

When he was a child, Chris Braun knew someone who was killed with an air gun. So he vowed to his sons, "ever since they could talk," that no guns would be allowed in their home.

That promise couldn't save Braun's 10-year-old son Tuesday afternoon.

Peter Braun died when a neighborhood friend playing with a pellet rifle shot him in the head. Peter was a fourth-grader at Desert Winds Elementary School in north Phoenix.

The lead pellet struck the boy behind his right ear at point-blank range. He was taken to St. Joseph's Hospital and Medical Center, where he later was pronounced dead.

Phoenix police said Peter and his 12-year-old brother were playing at home with a friend who owned the pellet rifle when they examined the weapon's chamber, found it empty and presumed the gun to be unloaded.

Even as they handled the gun, Peter's brother was on the telephone paging their father to seek permission to go to the friend's home to play, Sgt. Mike Torres said.

The friend, a 12-year-old boy whose name was withheld because of his age, pulled the trigger.

Chris Braun said he has long feared firearms and would not allow any type of gun in his household, "not even a squirt gun." He said he had no idea the boys were playing with the pellet gun until his 12-year-old told him moments after Peter was shot.

"We're all broken up right now," Braun said Tuesday night. "Peter was a good boy. He had a lot of friends.

The shooting, which took place about 1:45 p.m. in the 1400 block of West Renee Drive, just north of Union Hills Drive, was the second fatality in the Valley in the past six months involving an air rifle.

On Dec. 7, a teenager fatally wounded a younger stepbrother in their Apache Junction home.

Kyle Tomson, 10, died shortly after a BB pellet pierced the membrane around his heart and lodged in a blood vessel. The shooting was ruled accidental.

Firearms safety experts say that because BB guns, pellet guns and other similar weapons marketed for children are powered by air rather than gunpowder, many people underestimate their destructiveness.

At close range, they say, high-powered BB and pellet guns are capable of causing tissue damage similar to that of a conventional firearm, such as a .22-caliber handgun.

The velocity of the average BB is about 500 feet per second. A pellet's velocity ranges from 425 to 1,100 feet per second.




Photo # 1 - Two air rifles and one
pistol on top of blue robe.




Photo # 2 - The fatal pellet was found




Photo #3 - Satchel identifies this gun as
a Gaege Power Line 991.




Photo #4 - Close up of trigger, warning




Photo # 6 - View of the second air




Photo # 1 - Top view of Dining Table.
Table is not painted.




Photo # 2 - View from dining room




Photo # 10 - Front view of the




Photo # 11 - Notice blood on

APPROACH AND SUMMARY:

The CPSC resident investigators in a resident office heard a television broadcast of a pellet gun death incident. Simultaneously the local CPSC clipping service found the article. The incident was assigned by the regional center back to the local resident office for an In-Depth Investigation.

The incident involves an eight year old girl shooting a friend, a ten year old male in the chest. Children were shooting targets in the back yard when the victim moved between the shooter and the targets. The pellet penetrated the chest deeply and the victim soon died.

The investigation involves the interview of police investigators and the collection of police and newspaper reports. Autopsies were ordered but not received by the time of writing.

The information in the report is from police records and interviews unless otherwise specified.

PRE-INCIDENT:

The victim was a normal ten year old male. He was of average physical stature and had no known handicaps. He was from an intact middle class home of white collar workers. The victim's seven year old sister was present during the incident. She was an average youngster.

The shooter of the victim was likewise an average and normal eight year old female. She lived in the house of the incident and she was from a middle class family. Her seven year old brother and mother were present at the time of the incident. There was also present at the shooting an eight year old boy not related to any of the previously mentioned persons. All the males were friends for some time and played well together. The same was true for the females. All children were generally not a discipline problem or high risk takers.

The home was in a well maintained, modern neighborhood and the house was likewise well serviced. The parents were white collar. The shooter's mother is a registered nurse (RN) and she administered to the victim after the event.

The community is a suburb of a large western metropolitan area at high altitude. The community has all the modern services.

The pellet gun or a BB gun had been used by all of the children previously. All are thought to have known the rules of guns as specified by their parents. None took a formal course in gun or weapons safety.

The pellet gun had also been used many times previously. IT had worked well without incident before the fatal incident. It appears that all the children knew that BB and pellet guns could hurt but that a fatal shot was impossible (or improbable).

In prior usage of the gun, similar targets and ammunition had been used. At other times, targets were hung on the wooden stake fence. The fence was full of holes and partial holes (holes part of the way through the fence). Behind the fence was a house. It was vacant. The house appeared to have been hit by the use of guns previously. There were no prior complaints of the children shooting.

INCIDENT:

The incident occurred on July 13th, a Friday, at about 1:30 PM mountain standard time. The day was the birthday of one of the fire attendees at the shooting party.

The day was bright, warm and dry. The female attendees at the event had been swimming previously. The boys had been playing around the house. The boys, including the victim who did not live permanently in the house, had stayed the previous night at the home of the incident. There was a birthday party the night before the incident.

The girls, immediately prior to the event, were playing in the front yard of the home. The boys had previously set up the yard for shooting. The boys had been shooting for half an hour or more at the time of the incident.

Targets of various types were hung or placed on the fence. These included paper, cans, and plastic targets. All the boys had been shooting. There were three weapons in the yard and all were being used in the shooting game. They included a BB pistol, a BB rifle and a pellet rifle (the very one involved in the fatality). The youngsters were firing from the home's rear patio to the fence, a distance of approximately fifty feet.

The mother of the shooter is ~~the~~ owner of the house. She looked out occasionally to assure order and the following of rules by the shooting party. She did not make any shooting corrections during the shooting party.

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The girls had been in the back yard for about 5 minutes. The sister of the birthday boy and daughter of the home owner was shooting, having already taken several shots. The victim was standing to her left by about five feet. The girl had taken her turn and the turn of the other girl and had possibly continued to shoot beyond her turn. The victim in order to get her to stop was possibly going to remove the targets. The boy moved, possibly quickly, at an angle in front of the shooter. He was hit by a pellet. The gun would have been pointed nearly at the targets if the victim was not in the way.

The gun had been previously pumped up with five full pumps.

The victim was wearing light clothes. He was wearing a short sleeve shirt and shorts. He was bare footed.

When he was hit the victim made a noise. He then fell to the ground and rolled slightly. The shooter and others had shouted that the victim had been shot. The victim got up and walked to the rear door of the house and was taken in by the mother, the RN.

Inside, the victim threw up and it appeared to contain blood. He then fell to the floor. The RN mother lifted the shirt and was the wound. She cleared the throat and started CPR. She also had one of the children call emergency services, the police.

The first attempts to telephone help were futile. The other children went to the neighbor.

POST-INCIDENT:

The police, with the use of their in-coming call identification system, traced the call to the house of the incident. They sent out personnel. A neighbor also completed a call to the police and explained the event. The police in turn requested that medical personnel respond. Quite a contingent of emergency personnel descended on the home of the incident within a very short time.

The mother of the shooter contacted her attorney and the attorney soon arrived on the scene. He gave advice to the family on statements on the incident and other matters.

As soon as the situation was sized up by police, an emergency helicopter was summoned. It took the victim to a local emergency hospital. The child was taken immediately to an operating room. Work on the child was insufficient to revive the boy and the child was pronounced dead.

Police at the house of the incident divided up the witnesses, participants and neighbors, and took statements from all while collecting material, photographs, etc. These statements, work, etc. in part are included with this report. Photographs were taken but not obtained as part of this report.

A copy of the autopsy was ordered by the CPSC but has not been received. The autopsy was completed on the 15th of July, 1990.

According to the preliminary medical statements, the bullet entered between the right nipple and the neck. The shell passed through the right anterior chest, the right lung and penetrated the pulmonary artery. The pellet severed the pericardial sack. The pellet entrance was approximately one-quarter of an inch. The hospital and the emergency personnel never got a heart beat.

The pellet could not be immediately found in the chest of the victim. X-rays were taken of the entire body after the operating room work. The pellet was found in the right upper leg near the hip and near the main bone. The pellet was removed and taken into evidence by the police.

PRODUCT:

The weapon involved directly in the incident was a pellet gun. The pellet gun was purchased for Christmas, 1988 for the family and mostly for the young males of the family of the shooter. It is thought that the gun was purchased locally but the name of the retailer is being kept confidential.

The pellet gun was identified as a Daisy 880 Powerline, .177 caliber/BB caliber. Daisy guns are a product of Daisy Mfg. Co, Rogers, AR 72756. For the pellet operation, the gun is a single load. There was no pellet in the chamber at the time the weapon was taken into custody. The property custodian states that the weapon looks un-modified and not abused or mis-used.

The pellets were purchased separately by the users and were packaged in a black plastic rectangular box. The box is marked with the name Daisy but with no part number. The pellets are blunt nosed. The box is partially full.

The ammunition was purchased locally also and again the name of the retailer is being kept confidential.

The evidence will remain in the custody of the local police for at least one-half year.

STANDARDS:

The Consumer Product Safety Commission has no standards that cover pellet guns or pellet ammunition.

Manufactures have standards that cover the design and manufacture of pellet guns and the associated ammunition.

Various governmental entities and private locals have rules, regulations and requirements for the carrying and use of pellet guns. The community of the incident did not have any regulations on having or using pellets on private property. Surrounding communities have more stringent laws in the use and handling of pellet guns.

Thornton boy, 10, killed by shot from pellet gun

A backyard game turned into tragedy yesterday when a 10-year-old Thornton boy was fatally shot with a pellet gun.

Andy [redacted] was shot in the chest when he strayed in front of an 8-year-old girl who was playing with a pellet gun along with four other youngsters. The boy was taken to St. Anthony Hospital at 10 p.m. where he was pronounced

dead. Several children were playing in the back yard of a house at 13386 [redacted] Circle, across the street from Andy's home when the shooting occurred at 8:05 p.m.

Police said one parent was in the house when the shooting occurred. The gun was a Daisy Power Line .177 pellet rifle. A charge was filed for the pellet. The

At least one of the children phoned authorities.

The accidental shooting occurred as the boy was walking past a bottle set up for target practice. The pellet entered his chest and apparently severed a major artery. He was pronounced dead 90 minutes later after being airlifted to St. Anthony Hospital Central.

The gun, a Daisy Powerline 880, had been a Christmas gift to the 8-year-old girl's brother. Several children said it is not uncommon for 7- to 10-year-old kids in the area to fire BB guns or pellet rifles at pigeons or bottles.

"He got the gun from his dad. I'd like to kill his dad right now," said 16-year-old Brian [redacted], who was tossing a baseball with a

friend two hours after the shooting "to get our minds off of it."

Police Lt. Karl Wilmes said there is no ordinance in Thornton restricting the use of pellet guns among juveniles. But in Englewood it is illegal for anyone to shoot a BB gun except on an authorized range, and in Denver it is against the law for minors to carry BB guns.

The shooting marked at least the second serious incident involving a pellet gun this year in the metro area. In February, 10-year-old Sean Mulcahy of Englewood was

hit and seriously wounded by a BB fired from a pump-powered pellet gun while playing with friends.

Thornton police will meet with the Adams County District Attorney's office next week to decide how the latest case should be settled. The parents of the 8-year-old girl are not under investigation, Wilmes said.

[redacted], who lived across the street from the house where he was shot, was being watched by the girl's mother. Five children were playing in the backyard with the gun when he was hit at 3:05

p.m. Police said they were being intermittently supervised.

Police and paramedics sped to the scene and an AirLife helicopter landed in the intersection near the home at 13386 Albion Circle. [redacted] apparently never regained consciousness.

The young boy was remembered last night as a "cocky kid" who enjoyed riding his bike and playing Nintendo.

"He'd always say, 'Where's my happy meal, because I work at McDonald's,'" [redacted] said. "I'm [redacted] that."

Girl, 8, kills boy by accident

Pellet gun fired at target hits friend

THORNTON — An 8-year-old girl accidentally shot and killed a 10-year-old playmate yesterday when she fired a pump-action pellet gun at a bottle in her backyard but missed the target and hit her friend.

Immediately after Andy [redacted] was shot, the young girl ran yelling through the neighborhood, pounding on doors and screaming for someone to call an ambulance.

"She came to my door and asked to use the telephone, but she is always pulling pranks so I said no and shut the door," said 14-year-old Robert [redacted]. When he looked out moments later, she had run off to try another door.

At the same time, the girl's mother, who apparently carried the wounded boy into her home, sought to resuscitate him as other neighborhood children watched.

"I came in the kitchen and he was on the floor with his shirt rolled up (to his chest)," said 10-year-old Toni [redacted]. "She was giving him CPR, pushing on his stomach, and she was telling everybody to call for help."

At 1615 hours I was contacted by Sergeant Vince DeForest who requested I respond to 13386 ██████████ Circle to assist patrol in regards to a report of a juvenile that had been shot in the chest with a pellet gun. Myself and Dana Palmateer responded to that location. Upon our arrival I did note that Sergeant Kevin Orcutt, Officer Randy Goin, Officer Lori Moriarty and Lab Technician Bob Lloyd were all at the scene. Bob Lloyd met me at the end of the driveway and took me and D. Palmateer to the back yard where the shooting had occurred. B. Lloyd then pointed out some small black metal targets that were sitting on the center board of a wooden fence. I also noted there were some cans along this fence. In looking at the metal targets I noted that there was a number of holes into the wooden fence, in fact, some of the holes had gone clear through the fence and into the adjacent house. B. Lloyd then pointed out a rifle that was laying on the grass to the east side of the patio which was later identified as a pellet rifle. He advised me that this was the weapon that had been used. I noted at that time there was a rifle also laying on the patio table that was setting on the patio. It was later determined that that weapon was a B-B gun by Bob Lloyd.

I was then contacted by Officer Goin who advised me that there had been five kids in the back yard when the shooting took place and that the four children had witnessed the shooting. He identified them as being Karen ██████████, Jennifer ██████████, Jimmy ██████████ and Ryan ██████████ who were inside the residence and did need to be interviewed. The victim, Andy ██████████, had been air-lifted to St. Anthony's Central Hospital. R. Goin then did give me a brief synopsis of what had occurred. He stated that all of the children were in the back yard shooting at the cans and targets on the wooden fence when A. ██████████ ran in front of Jennifer ██████████ and was shot in the chest area, that Andy ██████████ then went to the rear door of the house where Jennifer ██████████'s mother, Jean ██████████ assisted Andy ██████████ to the kitchen area where he collapsed at which time Jean Judge started CPR.

D. Palmateer interviewed the two girls, Jennifer ██████████ and Karen ██████████. I interviewed the two boys. The first one I spoke with was Ryan ██████████ who is eight years old. I noted that R. ██████████ was visibly shaken and upset. I did talk to him in the living room area of the residence and asked him if he could tell me as best he remembered what happened. He stated that he had been shooting the pellet and the B-B gun along with Andy ██████████ and Jimmy ██████████ that Andy ██████████ had been shooting the pellet gun at a can on the fence, that he put it down on the chair that was sitting in the grass area on a corner of the patio.

Ryan Walker stated that Jennifer [redacted] picked up the gun and was pointing it towards the fence where the targets were at. Ryan Walker stated that Andy Walker was standing to the left of Jennifer about five feet. Ryan Walker stated he was sitting in a chair on the patio and that Jimmy [redacted] was sitting next to him and that Jimmy [redacted] was loading his B-B gun. Ryan Walker stated that all of a sudden Andy Walker went right in front of Jennifer [redacted] as she shot the rifle. Ryan Walker stated that Andy Walker grabbed his chest, kind of rolled on the ground, got up, went to the back door where Jean [redacted] helped Andy Walker into the house and started first aid.

I then spoke to Jimmy [redacted] who stated that Andy Walker had been shooting the pellet gun and that he had put it down. Jimmy [redacted] wasn't sure if he put it down on the patio or on the chair. It should also be noted that Jimmy [redacted] was extremely upset during the interview. He kept asking how Andy Walker was. Jimmy [redacted] stated that after Andy Walker put the weapon down, his sister, Jennifer [redacted], picked it up, aimed it towards the targets that were on the fence. Then all of a sudden, Jimmy [redacted] stated, Andy ran in front of his sister, Jennifer [redacted], as she shot the gun. Jimmy [redacted] stated that Andy Walker grabbed his chest, kind of rolled on the ground, got up, went to the back door where Jimmy [redacted]'s mother, Jean [redacted], started first aid on Andy Walker.

On completion of this interview I was contacted by Sergeant Kevin Orcutt who advised me that Andy Walker had died at approximately 1631 hours at St. Anthony's Central.

I then spoke with Jean [redacted] who did hand me a written statement that she had made out in regards to what had occurred when Andy came to the rear door and what she did. Jean [redacted] stated that the night before there had been a birthday party and that Andy Walker and Ryan Walker had stayed over, that they had been playing outside most of the day. She thought that at about 1 or 1:30 p.m. they all asked if they could shoot the B-B and pellet guns. She stated that she didn't have any problem with this because the kids had done it before and that she kept checking on the boys and the last time when she checked on them and came into the house momentarily, that the girls, Karen [redacted] and Jennifer [redacted] were out in front of the house. Jean [redacted] stated the next thing she remembered was that Andy Walker was at the back door and said Jennifer had hit him. Jean [redacted], referring to her statement, noted blood on the toes and hand of Andy Walker. Upon seeing the wound in the chest area, Jean [redacted] immediately put pressure to the area and

then gave Andy ██████████ CPR when he stopped breathing. Jean ██████████ stated that the gun belonged to her children and that Jennifer ██████████ does know how to use the gun, has shot it before. At that time I was interrupted by her attorney Ronald Hahn who asked if he could talk to his client for a moment. Ronald Hahn and Jean ██████████ then left the dining room where we were talking and walked upstairs into her bedroom. Shortly thereafter Sergeant Orcutt went upstairs and broke the news to Jean ██████████ that Andy ██████████ had died. Ronald Hahn then met with me and asked if there was any further questions of Jean ██████████, and if at all possible, could it wait? I advised him that would be no problem. If I needed to talk to her further I would recontact him prior to talking to her.

At 1805 I placed a call to the on-call Deputy Don Quick to advise him of the on-going investigation. At 1845 I did speak with Don Quick and gave him the details of what had occurred. Approximately 1850 I received a message that Coroner Jack Dewey had called and advised that the pellet had not been recovered and that there would be an autopsy conducted on Sunday, 07-15-90, at 10:00 A.M. by Dr. Jill Gould. I notified Sergeant Vince DeForest and Deputy DA Don Quick of the autopsy.

On 07-15-90 approximately 10:10 A.M. Dr. Jill Gould did conduct an autopsy on Andy ██████████. Present during the autopsy was Lab Technician Robert Lloyd, Deputy DA Don Quick, Deputy DA Investigator Dave Flynn and Detective Robert Wilson and Coroner Jack Dewey. Technician Robert Lloyd did take photographs and was given the pellet that was recovered by Dr. Gould in the right leg of Andy ██████████ in a vein in the right leg. This was recovered and given to Technician Bob Lloyd by Dr. Gould at approximately 11:20 A.M.



Date of autopsy: July 5, 1990

HISTORY: This 10 year old Caucasian male was playing with a group of friends in the back yard shooting an air pistol when he inadvertently darted in front of the person shooting the gun and sustained a gunshot wound to the chest. Resuscitative efforts were unsuccessful and he was pronounced dead.

EXTERNAL EXAMINATION: The body is that of a well developed and well nourished Caucasian male measuring 53 inches in height and weighing approximately 62 pounds. Livor extends posteriorly and rigor mortis is fully developed. The head is normocephalic and the scalp is covered with short red hair. The irides are blue, the pupils are round and equal. The sclerae and conjunctivae are pale and free of petechial hemorrhages. The ears, nose and mouth demonstrate normal development. The teeth are in a good state of repair. No lesions are noted in the oropharynx. The neck, chest, abdomen, back and extremities are without congenital deformities. The external genitalia are of a normal prepubescent male. The testes are in the scrotal sac bilaterally. The anus is unremarkable. Examination of the hands fail to demonstrate any foreign material. The body is identified by a tag on the left great toe inscribed [REDACTED]

EVIDENCE OF INJURY:

GUNSHOT WOUND: On the right side of the chest is a 0.5 cm, round gunshot wound of entrance which has its midpoint 4 1/4 inches superior to the right heel, 1 1/8 inches lateral to the midpoint of the sternum and 4 inches medial to the lateral aspect of the chest. The wound is circumscribed along its superior and medial margin with a 1 mm. rim of abrasion. No gunshot residue or stippling are noted around the wound. The wound perforates the intercostal muscles of the chest between right ribs 2 and 3. The bullet proceeds medially and posteriorly, perforating the posterior aspect of the aorta 0.5 cm. distal to the aortic valve. The edges of the wound demonstrate irregular laceration and infiltration with extravasated blood. The bullet enters the systemic circulation and is recovered in the right femoral artery where it has metastasized. The surrounding musculature and soft tissue along the femoral artery are infiltrated with extravasated blood. The bullet is lodged firmly within the lumen of the femoral artery. The bullet consists of a gray metal pellet measuring 5 x 4 mm, and is recovered in the right femoral artery, 12 cm. distal to the bifurcation of the iliacs. The bullet pathway is from right to left, front to back and slightly downward.

On the superior aspect of the forehead just to the right of the midline is a 1 mm. red abrasion. Along the right side of the bridge of the nose is a 0.2 x 0.2 cm., superficial red abrasion. Along the lateral aspect of the right naris is a 1 x 1 cm. red abrasion and along the lateral aspect of the naris is a 0.6 x 0.2 cm. red abrasion.

On the anterior aspect of the right lower chest just inferior to the costal margin is a 6 x 2 cm. brown-red abrasion.

Scattered across the anterior aspect of the right knee is a 0.9 cm. red acute abrasion and a 1 cm. red-blue contusion. Along the anteromedial aspect of the distal 1/3 of the right lower leg is a 1.5 x 1 cm. purple contusion.

On the extensor surface of the mid 1/3 of the right upper arm are three irregular red abrasions, the largest of which measures up to 0.2 cm. On the dorsal aspect of the right hand overlying the proximal 3rd metacarpal area is a 1.3 cm. oval scar. Overlying the 2nd metacarpal is a 0.3 cm., well healed scar.

No additional injuries are noted.

SCARS AND IDENTIFYING CHARACTERISTICS: On the extensor surface of the mid 1/3 of the right forearm is a horizontally oriented, 3 cm., well healed scar.

Superior to the left knee is a 1.5 cm., curvilinear, well healed scar. Along the lateral aspect of the same knee is a 1 cm., oval, well healed scar. Just inferior to the right knee is a curvilinear, 3 cm. scar. Scattered across the extensor surface of the anterior aspect of the left lower leg are multiple irregularly shaped scars, the largest of which measures up to 1 cm.

On the dorsal aspect of the left forearm are multiple scars, the largest of which measures up to 1 cm.

EVIDENCE OF THERAPY: Commencing along the lateral aspect of the right clavicle and extending medially across the sternum is a 23 cm. incised wound which is closed with surgical suture material. The intervening intercostal muscles are infiltrated with extravasated blood. This represents a therapeutic thoracotomy site. Commencing at the left midaxillary line and extending toward the sternum is a 22 cm. thoracotomy incision closed with surgical suture material. The wound perforates the intercostal muscles between left ribs 5 and 6 which are infiltrated with extravasated blood.

Protruding from the right naris is a nasogastric tube whose tip is subsequently identified in the stomach. Protruding from the mouth is an endotracheal tube whose tip is subsequently identified within the stomach.

Subjacent to the right clavicle is an intravenous catheter. On the anterior aspect of the right shoulder and anterior aspect of the left lower chest are adhesive electrocardiograph patches.

In both right and left antecubital fossae and dorsal aspect of the left hand are intravenous catheters.

Protruding from the penis is a urinary catheter. Extending from the rectum is a rectal tube.

Superior to both right and left medial malleoli are recent incised wounds closed with surgical suture material representing intravenous catheter sites. Each of these incisions measure 4 cm.

INTERNAL EXAMINATION: The right and left pleural cavities each contain approximately 200 cc. of liquid blood. The pericardial sac has been previously opened. The peritoneal cavity is free of excess fluid. The viscera and omentum are normally disposed.

MUSCULOSKELETAL SYSTEM: The musculoskeletal system is intact with the exception of the previously described injuries.

CARDIOVASCULAR SYSTEM: The 250 gram heart was covered with a normal pericardial sac. The epicardial surface demonstrates multiple areas of petechial hemorrhage. On the anterior aspect of the right ventricle along the superior 1/3 is a 1 cm. incised wound which is closed with surgical suture material. Along the apex of the right ventricle is a 0.5 cm. incised wound closed with surgical suture material. The coronary arteries follow the usual courses and distributions. The endocardial surfaces are red-gray, smooth and glistening. The myocardium is red-brown and slightly soft. The right and left ventricles are dilated. The cardiac valves demonstrate their normal size and position relationships. The ductus arteriosus and foramen ovale are nonpatent. The aorta and pulmonary artery follow the usual courses and distributions.

RESPIRATORY SYSTEM: The external surfaces of the larynx, trachea and mainstem bronchi are unremarkable. The hyoid bone and thyroid cartilage are intact. The mucosal surfaces of the larynx, trachea and mainstem bronchi are slightly hyperemic. The right and left lungs weigh 400 and 380 grams, respectively. The pleural surfaces are dark red-purple, smooth and firm. Along the lateral aspect of the left upper lobe is a 4 cm. superficial incised wound which has been closed with surgical suture material. Upon section, the parenchyma is red-brown, firm, congested, and upon compression, abundant liquid red-brown fluid exudes from the cut surfaces. No additional abnormalities are noted.

GASTROINTESTINAL SYSTEM: The external surfaces of the esophagus, stomach, small and large intestine are unremarkable. The appendix is present. The stomach contains 30 cc. of partially digested potatoes. The gastric mucosa is mildly hyperemic. The small intestine contains semiliquid yellow-green material and the colon contains soft green stool. The 1420 gram liver is covered with a shiny red-brown capsule. Upon section, the parenchyma is red-brown and firm. The gallbladder contains an estimated 10 cc. of viscous green bile. The mucosal surface is velvety green and the bile drainage is unobstructed.

RETICULOENDOTHELIAL SYSTEM: The 90 gram spleen is covered with a wrinkled gray capsule. Upon section, the parenchyma is red-brown and firm. The lymph nodes and bone marrow are unremarkable.

ENDOCRINE SYSTEM: The thyroid gland, bilateral adrenal glands and pancreas are unremarkable.

GENITOURINARY SYSTEM: The right and left kidneys weigh approximately 90 grams each. The cortical surfaces are pale tan, smooth and glistening. Upon section, there are distinct corticomedullary markings. The medullae, pelves and ureters

are unremarkable. The urinary bladder contains no urine. The mucosal surface is pale tan except for a single submucosal hematoma measuring 1 x 1.5 cm. The prostate is composed of homogeneous pale tan tissue free of nodularity. The bilateral testes are unremarkable.

HEAD: Reflection of the scalp fails to demonstrate any contusions. The 1480 gram brain is covered with transparent meninges. There are no epidural, subdural or subarachnoid hemorrhages. The brain demonstrates mild edematous changes characterized by flattening of the sulci and gyri. The cerebrospinal fluid is clear. The cerebral vasculature is intact. Multiple coronal sections of the brain fail to demonstrate any neoplastic, congenital, traumatic or inflammatory lesions. The cervical spine is grossly intact. Stripping the dura from the skull and calvarium fails to demonstrate any skull fractures.

TOXICOLOGY: Blood, vitreous

MICROSCOPIC EXAMINATION:

LIVER: Sections of liver are remarkable for a few glycogenated nuclei within the hepatocytes.

STOMACH: The superficial layers of the gastric mucosa are markedly congested.

LUNGS: Sections of lungs show alveolar spaces which are expanded and focally contain collections of extravasated erythrocytes. There is marked vascular congestion. Focal areas demonstrate atelectasis.

SPLEEN: The spleen is markedly congested.

HEART: Sections of heart show extravasated erythrocytes along the epicardial surface. No significant inflammation is identified.

THYMUS: The thymus demonstrates prominent Hassall's corpuscles and involution.

BRAIN: Sections of brain are unremarkable.

AORTA: Sections of aorta show disrupted adipose tissue and fibrous connective tissue infiltrated with extravasated erythrocytes.

KIDNEYS, PROSTATE, TESTES, ADRENALS, THYROID: Sections are unremarkable.

SKIN FROM GUNSHOT WOUND: The specimen shows stratified squamous epithelium which is focally disrupted. The underlying connective tissue demonstrates coagulative necrosis. Embedded within the depths of the wound is a small fragment of black particulate matter consistent with gunshot residue. Adjacent to this are two particles of birefringent material consistent with a foreign body.



ADDENDUM

An IDI was submitted on the pellet gun death of a 10 year old male who was shot by an 8 year old girl in a her back yard during a game of target practice. On the 28 of August, 1990, I re-visited the investigating police headquarters to get (1) photos, (2) additional information on rifle or ammunition testing and (3) any other information that had become available.


Photos were taken at the scene, post incident, by the police department. These photos are being delayed in their release due to the pending civil and criminal action that may be filed. A letter was written to the police department requesting copies of the photographs when they become available.

Since the initial IDI was submitted, the police department sent the pellet rifle to the state test laboratory. At the laboratory, the muzzle velocity of the weapon was determined using different numbers of pumps. It is thought by the test laboratory and the police department that the minimum muzzle velocity required to pierce the average skin is 331 feet per second. The test laboratory found that two pumps of the test weapon produced muzzle velocities that exceeded the 331 value. Five pumps were claimed to have been in the rifle during the fatal shot. The lab found that five pumps gives a muzzle velocity of over five hundred feet per second. The laboratory also tested the rifle at ten and twenty pumps. The police department searched a considerable period of time for the state's test report but without finding it. A franked envelope, pre-addressed to this office was left with the police department. They promised to send the test report as soon as they find it.


Also since submission of the IDI, a diagram of the incident scene was added to the police file. A copy of the diagram is enclosed.

I visited the police department, and interviewed the police officer who had investigated the accident. He provided me with a copy of the police report. I interviewed by telephone the victim's father. The victim was present with his father to answer some questions during the interview. Also, contact by telephone to the BB gun owner's residence revealed an unidentified person declining to be interviewed regarding the accident. I could not observe the product.

The 14 year old male victim was healthy & normal prior to the accident. He and the 12 year old boy (the person who shot the BB gun) had been friends for a few years, and would often play with each other. During the spring & summer of 1990 when the victim was visiting his friend's house, they would often play with the pump air BB rifle. This had always been done under the supervision of the friend's father. The victim's friend (and friend's family) lived in a rural area on approximately 3 acres of land, and the two boys would use the BB gun on the plot of land. Neither boy had any problems or potential accident with the BB gun prior to the day of the accident.

On the day of the accident the victim was visiting his friend's house. The victim and his friend were playing. Because it was a warm summer day, the victim was not wearing any shirt & was bare-chested. Unknown to the friend's father and mother, the friend retrieved the BB gun, as he and the victim wanted play with it. As stated earlier, both boys had played with the BB gun previously.

ACCIDENT

The accident occurred on 8/10/90, just outside of the friend's house. The 12 year old friend thought the safety to the gun was "on", but apparently did not closely examine the safety. The safety was of a "button" type that was located behind the trigger guard (metal guard protecting the trigger). The friend also thought that there were no BBs in the gun. Within moments after bringing the BB gun outside, the friend pumped the gun 3 times, pointed the gun at the victim, and pulled the trigger, not thinking that the gun would fire any BB. There was approximately 2½ to 3 feet distance between the victim & the gun barrel. The gun went off, and a BB shot into the victim's abdomen. The victim's father stated that the BB was a normal sized copper BB. There were no adults present during this incident.

POST ACCIDENT

At the time the victim knew that a BB had struck him, but didn't know that it may have actually entered his abdomen. A short time later her went home. He complained to his parents that his abdomen hurt, and informed them of the incident. The victim's parents then took the victim to the hospital. The victim was X-rayed, and a BB was found in his abdomen muscle. The victim was held overnight for observation, and it was determined by physicians that the presence of the BB in the victim's abdomen was not expected to pose any long term problems. No operation was performed to remove it. The victim was released. The victim's injury appears to be healing normally now, though he still returns to a phsician to monitor his progress.

PRODUCT IDENTIFICATION

According to the police officer, and the victim's father the BB gun was a Daisy 280 pump air rifle. The victim believed that it was 2 to 3 years old. I telephoned a local retailer to obtain the location (address) of Daisy, and I was told by the retailer that Daisy guns are made by Daisy Manufacturing Co., Inc., Rogers, Arkansas 72757. The victim's father stated that the BB was a normal sized copper BB. This was the only product indentification available.

A 14-YEAR-OLD [REDACTED] BOY was accidentally shot in the stomach with a BB gun by his 12-year-old friend Aug. 10. According to [REDACTED] Police, the boys were playing and the 12-year-old thought the safety was on when he pulled the trigger and the gun when off. The victim was taken to [REDACTED] Hospital in [REDACTED] where doctors determined that they would leave the pellets in the boy's abdomen. Officer [REDACTED] said the victim had been released from the hospital and doctors did not expect the BB pellets to cause any problems. The Daisy 280 pump air-rifle was confiscated by the 12-year-old's father, police said. No charges will be filed in the incident. According to [REDACTED] it is illegal for anyone under 18 to be in possession of an air rifle unless accompanied by an adult.
