SUMMARY: Mr. Schlosser visited Commissioner Moore to express support for the proposed amendments to the Children's Sleepwear Flammability Standards. The proposed amendments would exempt tight-fitting garments and garments intended for infants from the requirements of the standards. Mr. Schlosser's company manufactures underwear garments made of cotton fabric that are permitted to be marketed under the current stay of enforcement. He said that the stay has created increased sales for this product line.

Mr. Schlosser said that neither his company nor his competitors have received any reports of burn injuries associated with these underwear garments since the stay went into effect. He emphasized that burn injuries to children have not increased since the stay, even though underwear sales are up.

Commissioner Moore promised to consider the information and position provided by Mr. Schlosser.
