CPSC and Rocky Mountain Poison Control each presented their transition period reports. The findings were similar between the two reports. There was an apparent decline in injuries and exposures relative to sales over the July 2013 to December 2016 time period. Both reports cited two child fatalities in 2013.

3. Age Grading

4. ISO Standard

ISO is seeking to make a standard for Liquid Laundry Packets via members in France, Germany and China. ASTM is working through ANSI to discourage this as redundant

standards can cause problems. If there is something they find inadequate about the ASTM standard they recommend bringing the issue to ASTM.
