**SUMMARY OF MEETING:**

The meeting was led by Bob Crowley. The meeting was a preliminary discussion on products that are tricycles that have a stroller mode associated with them (e.g. a tricycle with a handle and a reversible seat). There was general agreement that the distinction between a stroller and a tricycle is whether the child can propel themselves. Features that may distinguish a stroller mode from a tricycle mode that were discussed include: age of the child, activity mode vs. transport mode, a reversed or reclined mode that prevents the child from accessing the pedals, and pedals that are disabled into a freewheeling mode. Committee chairs plan to discuss this category of product and related incident data in upcoming Ad hoc scope task group and Carriages and Strollers subcommittee meetings.
