**SUMMARY OF MEETING: Julia Costello conducted the meeting:**

- 1. Ms. Costello stated that a testing lab representative questioned if a specific product is a bather or an infant bath tub accessory. The TG agreed the specific product can only be used when attached to an infant bath tub, therefore, it is an infant bath tub accessory.**
- 2. The TG then discussed 3 other examples of products to determine agreement as to their identification. All three products are stand-alone products that support an infant during bathing. The TG all agreed they meet the definition of**

infant bather. One product is also advertised and marketed as being used in an infant bath tub, therefore, it should also meet the accessory requirements in the infant bath tub standard.

3. With no other discussion, Ms. Costello stated she will present the findings of the TG at the subcommittee meeting in May.
