SUMMARY OF MEETING: The ASTM representatives emphasized the importance of consistency between ASTM and CPSC regarding interpretation of ASTM safety standards. In particular, the ASTM representatives discussed the relationship between the ASTM F2057 and F3096 standards for clothing storage unit stability and furniture restraints, respectively. They shared the view that because the STURDY law and CPSC's implementing rules incorporate the F2057 standard, and F2057 in turn incorporates performance requirements set by F3096, the Commission should treat revisions to the performance requirements of F3026 as revisions to F2057, and review them following notification by ASTM.
