### Summary of Meeting:

This was the second draft meeting of the NFPA 30, *Flammable and Combustible Liquid Code*, Storage and Warehousing Technical Committee (TC). This TC is responsible for Chapters 9 through 16 of NFPA 30. The TC considered Public Comments (PCs) submitted to NFPA after publications of the first draft of the next edition of its chapters in NFPA 30. Staff submitted a PC to NFPA 30 on May 27, 2025, that was divided into two separate PCs, based on staff's proposed changes to clauses 9.4.1 (PC #22) and add a new annex (PC #21). Staff also participated on a task group which focused on proposed editorial changes related to definitions and submitted proposed changes (PC #19).

The TC discussed all PCs submitted. The TC discussed staff's PCs; staff advocated for the changes. Some TC members were concerned about adding non-fire safety requirements and were concerned that AHJs may have difficulty determining if products meet the requirements. The TC accepted both of staff's PCs, with a few minor editorial changes to the proposed new annex (PC #21).

The TC discussed the task group proposed editorial changes related to definitions. The TC was directed to not define "protected" and "unprotected" as the meaning varies throughout the code. The PC submitted was general and staff proposed specific language in Chapters 9, 12, 13, and 16. The TC accepted the proposed changes.

All the accepted changes will be added to the second draft ballot.

### Next Steps:

The other NFPA TCs will meet to develop the second draft ballot for the other chapters of NFPA 30. NFPA staff will ballot changes made during the second draft; changes that receive at least two-third of the votes will proceed to the published second draft of the next edition to NFPA 30. Staff will participate in future meetings as needed to support their proposed changes.
