Synopsis:

On September 2019 a 9-year-old girl died after crashing on her bicycle on a two lane paved road in front of her house.

Information Sources:

The information collected during this investigation was obtained from the County Sheriff and Coroner's offices.

Investigation Details:

On September, 2019 at approximately the victim (9 YOF; 53.5" Tall; 70 pounds) was riding her bicycle on a two lane paved road in front of her home. While she was travelling on a downhill grade on the road, she lost control of the bicycle and crashed. During her fall, the brake lever on the bicycle handlebars punctured her upper chest and neck.

The victim's mother heard the victim screaming and responded to the scene. She picked up the victim and carried her toward the house and a family member called 911.

EMT responded to the scene and declared the victim dead, and the coroner was notified. The victim's body was sent to the state medical examiner for an autopsy, along with the incident brake lever. The victim's manner of death was ruled accidental and her cause of death was exsanguination and lacerations of the lung and left subclavian artery. See the coroner's report at Exhibit-D.

The sheriff's investigation determined that the victim lost control of her bicycle's front wheel, which caused her to crash. The bicycle was collected as evidence by the sheriff's department.
