**RE:** Freedom of Information Act Request #23-F-00274: Any emails to or from Commissioner Richard L. Trumka Jr. including the keyword "gas" sent between January 1, 2023 to the time of the search.

Dear Mr. Gordon:

Thank you for your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request seeking records from the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC). Enclosed are emails responsive to your request, sent to or from Commissioner Richard Trumka, Jr., consisting of 378 pages.

Portions of the enclosed records are being withheld pursuant to FOIA Exemptions 5 and 6, 5 U.S.C. §§ 552(b)(5) and (b)(6). CPSC considered the foreseeable harm standard when reviewing these records and applying FOIA exemptions.

Exemption 5. FOIA Exemption 5 permits withholding from disclosure inter-agency and intra-agency memoranda that would not be available, by law, to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency. The staff memoranda and analyses being withheld are pre-decisional and deliberative, consisting of recommendations, opinions, suggestions, or analyses of technical and/or legal staff, and the disclosure which would expose the deliberative process and/or attorney-client privilege. It would not be in the public interest to disclose these materials because disclosure would impair the frank exchange of views necessary for such matters. We are withholding the following pages in their entirety from the responsive emails from Commissioner Trumka's emails: 4 (internal briefing agenda); 9 (interview preparation notes); 13-14, 36-37 (interview preparation notes); 334-346 (draft interview notes); and 337-338 (interview notes).

Exemption 6. FOIA Exemption 6 permits withholding personnel and medical files and similar files, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. Absent authorizations to disclose the records or personally identifying information from the persons identified in the records, such information falls within the protection of this FOIA exemption to disclosure and is withheld accordingly.

Commissioner Trumka,

Thank you for your service to the country and its consumers. In an interview with Bloomberg, you shared that the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) plans to issue a proposal to regulate natural gas stoves as soon as this year and that "[a]ny option is on the table," including a product ban. I am concerned about both the impact of a potential ban and the basis on which it is being considered.

Gas stoves have become essential to feed American families. In my home state of Ohio, as many as two-in-five households use gas for cooking.<sup>2</sup> Many local restaurants rely on gas stoves for the same reasons that home cooks do: they find them easier to cook with and cheaper to operate.<sup>3</sup> These Ohioans have suffered rising energy costs long enough and should not be forced to choose electric alternatives that tend to be more expensive to operate.<sup>4</sup>

But now they might have to because of a newfound "hidden hazard" that rests on limited research. For instance, your Bloomberg interview cited a recently published study that attributed more than 12% of childhood asthma cases to gas stove usage. But the authors conducted no tests of appliance-usage or exposure, failed to consider adequately other factors, and even found, in a review of 357 peer-reviewed studies, that "none reported new associations between gas stove use and childhood asthma specifically in North America or Europe." Another prominent study,

featured last year by the *New York Times*<sup>6</sup>, was based on an analysis of just 53 homes in California.<sup>7</sup> It is not the hazard that is "hidden," but your evidence for it.

The lack of compelling evidence betrays a different motive. Banning popular and heretofore harmless gas-powered appliances is just the latest effort to achieve progressive decarbonization goals by any means necessary, in this case under the guise of consumer protection: If consumers will not give up gas-powered appliances freely, then use the consumer protection authorities of the federal government to choke off demand for them. I am not fooled by this administration's campaign against natural gas, nor are everyday Ohioans.

Your chairman, Alexander Hoehn-Saric, has walked back your brazen remarks and pledged that the CPSC is "not looking to ban gas stoves." I wish I could believe his promises. But given the callous indifference of your remarks to the needs of everyday Ohioans and this administration's reckless campaign against American energy, I cannot.

I urge you to reevaluate the evidence of the alleged harms posed by gas-powered appliances, renounce any potential ban, and foreclose consideration of regulations that would restrict access to natural gas.

William Wallace, CR's associate director of safety policy, says it's appropriate for the agency to be thoughtful in its work as it looks into gas stoves.

"People expect household products to be safe, and not to put their family's health at risk," he says. "It's the CPSC's job to make sure companies meet these expectations—by researching potential hazards, collecting information from the public, identifying solutions, and crafting evidence-based rules for the marketplace. All this takes time."

Still, Wallace says the agency should respond quickly when new hazards emerge. "Lead paint used to be legal, but now it's not because the evidence mounted of its harms—especially to children. We're learning more about health and safety risks all the time, and it's vital for the CPSC to take action when warranted," he adds.



WE ACT for Environmental Justice is excited to share the results of our Out of Gas, In With Justice pilot which were published this week (here's a minute video)! In addition to uplifting the results, we want to work with your team to schedule an intimate briefing for CPSC staff to learn about the results and relevant policy and regulatory recommendations. We would like you, Commissioner Trumka, to attend, along with others to whom these results are most relevant. Who would be the best contact for me to coordinate the meeting?

For background: Out of Gas, In with Justice looked at the impacts on indoor air pollution when transitioning from gas to induction stoves. The pilot was conducted at 1471 Watson Avenue in the Bronx, which is slated to be the New York City Housing Authority's (NYCHA) first all-electric building conversion. The study is the first in the United States to monitor indoor air quality in homes transitioning from gas stoves to electric induction stoves with residents in-place in affordable housing.

We envision this as a short intimate meeting (30-45 minutes) kicking off with a briefing from our NY team on the Out of Gas, In with Justice Study and the topline results. Then, our Federal Policy Team will share policy/program recommendations for CPSC in light of the results. We would close with time for Q&A and reflections from you and other CPSC Staff.

- P.S. Here are some topline results from the 10-month monitoring:
  - Households with induction stoves experienced a 35 percent reduction in daily nitrogen dioxide (NO2) concentrations compared to those using gas stoves, when controlling for temperature and apartment-level factors.
  - 24-hour averages of carbon monoxide (CO) for households with gas stoves reached concentrations of 1.4 ppm whereas households with induction stoves had a 24-hour average of 0.8 ppm, a significant decrease.
  - When cooking a standardized meal for the controlled cook test on both a gas
    and induction stove in the NYCHA development, NO<sub>2</sub> concentrations in
    kitchens with gas stoves were on average 190 percent higher than in
    kitchens with induction stoves,
  - During focus groups with pilot participants, we found that participants
    unanimously loved their new induction stoves due to reasons like the ease
    of cooking, the time savings because the induction stove cooks faster and is
    easier to clean, the decreased reliance on other appliances, and the fact that
    the induction stove creates a safer cooking environment.

### US Safety Agency to Consider Ban on Gas Stoves Amid Health Fears

The US Consumer Product Safety Commission will move to regulate gas stoves as new research links them to childhood asthma.

A federal agency says a ban on gas stoves is on the table amid rising concern about harmful indoor air pollutants emitted by the appliances.

The US Consumer Product Safety Commission plans to take action to address the pollution, which can cause health and respiratory problems.

"This is a hidden hazard," Richard Trumka Jr., an agency commissioner, said in an interview. "Any option is on the table. Products that can't be made safe can be banned."

Natural gas stoves, which are used in about 40% of homes in the US, emit air pollutants such as nitrogen dioxide, carbon monoxide and fine particulate matter at levels the EPA and World Health Organization have said are unsafe and linked to respiratory illness, cardiovascular problems, cancer, and other health conditions, according to reports by groups such as the Institute for Policy Integrity and the American Chemical Society. Consumer Reports, in October, urged consumers planning to buy a new range to consider going electric after tests conducted by the group found high levels of nitrogen oxide gases from gas stoves.

New <u>peer-reviewed research</u> published last month in the International Journal of Environmental Research and Public Health found that more than 12% of current childhood asthma cases in the US can be attributed to gas stove use.

"There is about 50 years of health studies showing that gas stoves are bad for our health, and the strongest evidence is on children and children's asthma," said Brady Seals, a manager in the carbon-free buildings program at the nonprofit clean energy group RMI and a co-author of the study. "By having a gas connection, we are polluting the insides of our homes."

The Bethesda, Maryland-based Consumer Product Safety Commission, which has a staff of roughly 500, plans to open public comment on hazards posed by gas stoves later this winter. Besides barring the manufacture or import of gas stoves, options include setting standards on emissions from the appliances, Trumka said.

Lawmakers <u>have weighed in</u>, asking the commission to consider requiring warning labels, range hoods and performance standards. In a letter to the agency in December, lawmakers including Senator Cory Booker of New Jersey and Representative Don Beyer of Virginia, both Democrats, urged action and called gas-stove emissions a "cumulative burden" on Black, Latino and low-income households that disproportionately experience air pollution.

Parallel efforts by state and local policymakers are targeting the use of natural gas in buildings more broadly, in a push to reduce climate-warming emissions (such as from methane) that exacerbate climate change. Nearly 100 cities and counties have adopted policies that require or encourage a move away from fossil fuel powered buildings. The New York City Council voted in 2021 to ban natural gas hookups in new buildings smaller than seven stories by the end of this year. The California Air Resources Board unanimously voted in September to ban the sale of natural gas-fired furnaces and water heaters by 2030.

Consumers who want to switch from gas to electric ranges could get some help from the massive climate spending bill signed into law in August. The Inflation Reduction Act includes rebates of up to \$840 for the purchase of new electric ranges as part of some \$4.5 billion in funding to help low- and moderate-income households electrify their homes.

The Association of Home Appliance Manufacturers, which represents gas range manufacturers such as <u>Whirlpool Corp.</u>, says that cooking produces emissions and harmful byproducts no matter what kind of stove is used.

"Ventilation is really where this discussion should be, rather than banning one particular type of technology," said Jill Notini, a vice president with the Washington-based trade group. "Banning one type of a cooking appliance is not going to address the concerns about overall indoor air quality. We may need some behavior change, we may need [people] to turn on their hoods when cooking."

Natural gas distributors, whose business is threatened by the growing push to electrify homes, argue that a ban on natural gas stoves would drive up costs for homeowners and restaurants with little environmental gain. The American Gas Association, which represents utilities such as <u>Dominion Energy Inc.</u> and <u>DTE Energy Co.</u>, said in a statement that regulatory and advisory agencies responsible for protecting residential consumer health and safety have presented no documented risks from gas stoves.

"The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission and EPA do not present gas ranges as a significant contributor to adverse air quality or health hazard in their technical or public information literature, guidance, or requirements," said Karen Harbert, the group's president. "The most practical, realistic way to achieve a sustainable future where energy is clean, as well as safe, reliable and affordable, is to ensure it includes natural gas and the infrastructure that transports it."

Trumka, who before joining the commission worked for a House committee in a role that included work on toxic heavy metals in baby food and the health hazards of e-

cigarettes, said the commission could issue its proposal as soon as this year, though he conceded that would be "on the quick side."

"There is this misconception that if you want to do fine-dining kind of cooking it has to be done on gas," Trumka said. "It's a carefully manicured myth."

Following the release of a report showing that consumers are not being educated on the health risks of gas stoves, or how they can protect themselves with ventilation, at point of sale, U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) Commissioner Richard Trumka noted that the federal agency is planning on taking action on this issue in 2023, and that all options - including ending the sale of gas stoves, could be on the table:

"We need to be talking about regulating gas stoves, whether that's drastically improving emissions, or banning gas stoves entirely. And I think we ought to keep that possibility of a ban in mind as we follow along, because it's a powerful tool in our toolbox. It's a real possibility."

Trumka noted there are alternative cooking technologies that do not produce pollution and announced CPSC will be opening an RFI on this topic in the new year.







It's Wednesday. How the debate around gas stoves is playing out in California. Plus, in Montecito, million-dollar views still come with mudslide risks.

You may have heard chatter recently about gas stoves: whether they're bad for your health, or the planet's, and whether they're soon going to be banned in your city or state.

Last week, a suggestion that gas stoves may one day be regulated by the federal government started <u>a rumpus in Washington</u>. There's growing recognition that gas stoves <u>release hazardous chemicals</u> into homes, <u>contribute to global</u> <u>warming</u> and produce emissions that may be linked to rates of childhood asthma.

Bans on gas appliances are unlikely to advance in Washington anytime soon because of fierce opposition from the gas industry and its political allies. But what about in California?

For the past few years, our state has been on the leading edge of gas-stove bans.


Republicans tend to be the loudest defenders of natural gas, but gas-powered stoves tend to be most common largely in Democratic-controlled states, <u>my colleagues Elena Shao and Lisa Friedman report</u>. In fact, the state with the highest percentage of households using natural gas for cooking (70 percent) is

California, according to <u>a 2020 analysis</u> from the Energy Information Administration.

(If you have a gas stove, here's a guide to <u>mitigating the risks</u>. "No one should freak out," said Dr. Aaron Bernstein, the interim director of the Center for Climate, Health and the Global Environment at Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health.)

Much of the research on gas stoves is conducted in California, including recent highly publicized studies finding that the stoves <u>leak benzene</u>, a <u>carcinogen</u>, and methane, a potent greenhouse gas, <u>even when they're turned off</u>.


And "like many climate policies, the push to phase out natural gas in buildings began in California," <u>my colleague Brad Plumer writes.</u>

In 2019, Berkeley became the first city in the nation to <u>ban gas hookups</u>in most new residences and commercial buildings, mainly to reduce carbon emissions that contribute to climate change. Since then, at least 50 California cities and counties, including San Francisco, Sacramento and Los Angeles, <u>have adopted similar rules</u>, often over the objections of local gas utilities.

The industry has leaned heavily into promoting gas stoves, in the belief that consumers — and chefs — still love cooking over an open flame. The California Restaurant Association first sued Berkeley in 2019 over its ban.

There's no statewide regulation to prohibit gas stoves here, but California is pushing forward with other ways to limit use of natural gas.

Gas water heaters and furnaces remain popular in California homes, and in September, the California Air Resources Board unanimously approved a proposal to <u>ban the sale of all new gas furnaces and water heaters by 2030</u>. The regulation would require zero-emission alternatives like electric heating to be used instead. (Stoves wouldn't be affected.)

More votes are required before the rule would become official, but even so, the September vote is seen as a major step.


"We're really hopeful that this is the beginning of a domino effect, and other states will follow California's lead," Leah Louis-Prescott, a senior associate at RMI, a nonprofit group promoting a transition to clean energy, told Bloomberg at the time.





### Today's Action at the Speed of Moms:

Tell CPSC: Protect Our Families From Gas Stove Pollution

Dear friend,

You've probably heard a lot in the news lately about gas stoves. It's causing a lot of anxiety. We're feeling that anxiety too. In fact, we've been thinking about it for a while.

Last month we tested the gas stoves in our apartments for nitrogen dioxide (NO2), a harmful chemical that can cause and worsen asthma. Danielle learned that her stove emits harmful levels of NO2—the highest levels the tester had seen, in fact—and has been reluctant to use her stove since.

We both live in small apartments that can trap indoor pollutants. Plus, because we are renters, we can't just replace our major appliances. It is so frustrating that landlords and building owners are not aware of the pollutants and harm associated with gas stoves.

Many people across the country are in the same boat—unable to replace potentially dangerous appliances and worried about their health and the health of those they live with.

**But there is no need to panic.** There are things we can all do to protect ourselves from gas stove pollution—without the expense of replacing a working appliance.

First, join Moms Clean Air Force in calling on the Consumer Product Safety Commission to implement commonsense standards for these appliances. Range hoods should meet standards of performance. Methane leakage should be stopped with automatic shut-off valves. The public should have easy access to steps they can take to minimize the risk of these appliances.

CONTACT CPSC

Then, consider these ways to protect yourself and others in your home from pollution from your gas stove:

- If you have a vent hood, make sure it's on when cooking on the gas stove or using the oven.
- If you don't have a vent hood, open the windows while you're cooking.
- Call the gas company or a service technician to ask them to check the connections on your stove for leaks and tighten them up.
- Use alternative appliances for cooking and heating food where possible, like electric kettles, portable induction cooktops, toaster ovens, air fryers, and microwave ovens.
- Check with your city and county government to find an indoor air quality professional to perform a ventilation audit for your home.

Whenever you are ready to replace your gas stove, consider electric or induction cooktops—and keep an eye out for new rebate programs for clean appliance alternatives made available thanks to the Inflation Reduction Act.

Dear Chair Hoehn-Saric,

We write to express our strong opposition to reporting that certain members of the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) may seek an outright ban on gas ranges and stoves. We also request additional information about the CPSC's plans regarding this proposed action. On January 9, 2023, Bloomberg published an article outlining Commissioner Trumka's desire to see gas stoves banned. Since that time, our offices have fielded numerous calls from concerned constituents worried that they may not be able to purchase a new gas stove for their home moving forward. We were pleased to see your statement from January 11, 2023, that you are "not looking to ban gas stoves" at this time. However, given the uncertainties that Commissioner Trumka's comments have created, it is our hope that by getting additional information, we can better understand how the CPSC plans to move forward on this issue.

According to the Energy Information Administration, over one-third of U.S. households use gas stoves.<sup>3</sup> Consumers have chosen their home appliances based on numerous factors, including upfront price, operating costs, maintenance costs, and convenience. Gas stoves tend to result in lower utility bills than their electric counterparts.<sup>4</sup> Gas stoves are also generally more durable, with less parts being susceptible to breakages or other defects. A ban on these stoves would therefore likely result in higher utility bills, disproportionately affecting low-income populations. Additionally, a 2020 report from the National Fire Protection Association found that "households that used electric ranges showed a higher risk of cooking fires and associated losses than those using gas ranges."<sup>5</sup>

Like the CPSC, our desire is to ensure that consumer products are as safe as possible. Home appliances are some of the most expensive purchases that our constituents make each year, and those products must be designed first and foremost with safety in mind. However, we remain concerned about regulatory overreach from federal agencies. By denying consumers choice, the CPSC deciding to ban gas stoves would distort the marketplace and ultimately raise costs for consumers. Rather than pursuing this outright ban, we believe it would be most appropriate for the CPSC to gather additional information on the scope of the problem and, if appropriate, work with manufacturers to ensure that these stoves are as safe as possible.

Dear Chairman Hoehn-Saric,

We write today with deep concern regarding Commissioner Trumka's recent comments<sup>1</sup> about regulating gas stoves. We have heard from many of our constituents who are now suddenly, and rightfully, concerned about the future of gas stoves.

We recognize you have attempted to dissuade these concerns through reassurances<sup>2</sup> that the Consumer Product Safety Commission (the Commission) is not considering a ban on gas stoves. While that is encouraging, we remain concerned about the Commission's goals and potential future action on this issue.

While a gas stove ban is not yet on the table, the lead up to one is. In October 2022, the Commission adopted an amendment to begin the process of a Request for Information (RFI) to "seek public input on hazards associated with gas stoves and propose solutions to those hazards."

As you know, gas stoves are used in about 35 percent of households nationwide, nearly 40 million homes. The household figure in some states is closer to 70 percent. Natural gas stoves have been used for well over a century and have been proven to be both safe and efficient appliances.

We understand the Commission's mission is to ensure consumer safety. However, it is unclear what safety angle the Commission plans to take with the recent RFI.

If the Commission is concerned about the physical safety of consumers, the National Fire Protection Association has already proven that gas stoves pose a lower risk of cooking fires, deaths, and associated losses than other ranges.<sup>5</sup>

If the concern is about consumer health, neither the Commission nor the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has cited gas stoves as a significant contributor to adverse air quality or as a health

hazard. In fact, a 2013 study in the scientific journal *The Lancet* found "no evidence of an association between the use of gas as a cooking fuel and either asthma symptoms or asthma diagnosis." Additionally, RMI manager Brady Seals said that the recently circulated study by the *International Journal of Environmental Research and Public Health*" "does not assume or estimate a causal relationship" between childhood asthma and natural gas stoves.8

If the concern is about environmental health, the American Gas Association notes that residential natural gas accounts for only 4 percent of total U.S. greenhouse gas emissions. Furthermore, greater use of natural gas benefits our environment. Increased natural gas use has contributed to significant carbon emission reductions in the United States over the past 15 years. <sup>10</sup>

Despite the aforementioned evidence negating the hazards of gas stoves on both consumers' physical health and safety and the environment, we have seen reports indicating that your staff is still being directed to draft an RFI by March 1, 2023 regarding the "hazards associated with gas stoves and proposed solutions to those hazards." <sup>11</sup>

If this directive is still under consideration, please provide what event, peer reviewed research, or sudden new hazard has prompted this RFI since gas stoves have been in use for more than a century and studied for potential health hazards in the past.

In the event that the RFI is still moving forward, we urge that it be rescinded and that your office refrain from issuing a similar directive in the future.

Americans should be able to choose how to cook their food. Simply put, it is not the responsibility of the federal government to decide what kind of stove Americans can have in their kitchens. We appreciate your time and attention to this matter and look forward to receiving your response by February 24, 2023.
