<p>3.4. Sleep Bag, n – A product that is used to contain an infant's body during sleep that has a closure and encloses the infant's body and legs in a singular, bag-like structure; may or may not include arm holes and sleeves (short or long); also known as a sleep sack.</p>	<p>Suggest wearable blanket as umbrella term</p>
<p>3.5 Sleep Suit, n – A product that is used to contain an infant's body during sleep for the purpose of adding warmth, which has an opening for hands and feet.</p>	<p>Isn't the purpose to keep hands away from face?
