### Background

A UL Technical Harmonization Committee (THC) was formed to develop the 1<sup>st</sup> edition of UL/CSA 60335-2-30, Particular Requirements for Room Heaters. The purpose is to integrate North American safety requirements with International Electro-technical Commission (IEC) standards by adopting essential national deviations to address specific U.S. and Canadian safety concerns. This new standard seeks to replace both UL 1278 (Movable and Wall- or Ceiling-Hung Electric Room Heaters) and CSA C22.2 No. 46. It does not replace UL 2021 (for stationary electric heating appliances) or UL 1042 (for fixed and portable baseboard and wall heaters) as those U.S. specific requirements will not be incorporated into the draft at this time. Also, this first edition incorporates the latest U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) led revisions to UL 1278, ensuring it addresses recent improvements.

Reviewed comments and edits from the UL preliminary review

- The THC discussed defining wall-hung and ceiling-hung heaters to distinguish from fixed heaters.



- If a wall or ceiling hung heater can be removed from the wall or ceiling without the use of tools, the product will also have to meet portable heater requirements.
- Discussed the use of the UL probe vs IEC probes b and 18. Determined that these probes are not equivalent thus both UL and IEC probes will have to be used in the harmonized standard.
- Needed additional clarification on the disconnect requirements for removal of power. When on stand-by mode, the heater is still considered to be on.
