## TIME CRITICAL BALLOT VOTE DUE: Friday, October 27, 2023

Attached is a draft *Federal Register* notice announcing that, on October 23, 2023, the Commission received notification that ASTM F963-17, *Standard Consumer Safety Specification for Toy Safety*, has been revised. The Commission has incorporated ASTM F963-17 by reference in its mandatory toy standard, 16 C.F.R. part 1250.

Pursuant to section 106(g) of the Consumer Product Safety Improvement Act (CPSIA), ASTM must notify the Commission if revisions are made to ASTM F963. 15 U.S.C. § 2056b(g). The revised voluntary standard shall be considered a consumer product safety standard issued by the Commission effective 180 days after ASTM notifies the Commission unless, within 90 days after receiving that notice, the Commission notifies ASTM that the Commission has determined that the proposed revision does not improve the safety of the consumer product covered by the standard. *Id.* Consistent with section 106(g), staff is assessing the revised voluntary standard to determine its effect on safety.

The draft *Federal Register* notice would seek comment on whether the revision improves the safety of the consumer products covered by the standard. In order to provide sufficient time for consideration of any comments received and appropriate for Commission action within the 90-day statutory time frame, the draft notice provides a 14-day public comment period. Likewise, to expedite publication of the draft notice, the General Counsel has designated this matter as time critical pursuant to section V of the Commission's Decision Making Procedures.

**AGENCY:** Consumer Product Safety Commission.

**ACTION:** Notice of availability and request for comment.

**SUMMARY:** The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission's (Commission or CPSC) mandatory rule, Safety Standard Mandating ASTM F963 for Toys, incorporates by reference ASTM F963-17, *Standard Consumer Safety Specifications for Toy Safety*. The Commission has received notice of a revision to this incorporated voluntary standard. CPSC seeks comment on whether the revision improves the safety of the consumer products covered by the standard.

### **SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:**

Section 106(a) of the Consumer Product Safety Improvement Act of 2008 (CPSIA), mandated that ASTM F963–07ɛ1, *Standard Consumer Safety Specifications for Toy Safety*, shall be considered a mandatory consumer product safety standard issued by the CPSC. 1 15 U.S.C. 2056b(a). After compliance with ASTM F963 became mandatory in 2009, there were revisions to the voluntary standard in 2008, 2011, 2016, and 2017. Currently, ASTM F 963–17, with certain exceptions, is considered a consumer product safety standard issued by the Commission under section 9 of the Consumer Product Safety Act (CPSA). 16 CFR part 1250.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Section 106(a) of the CPSIA does not require CPSC to incorporate section 4.2 and Annex 4 of ASTM F963-07ε1, or any provision that restated or incorporated an existing mandatory standard or ban promulgated by the Commission or by statute.

On October 23, 2023, ASTM notified CPSC of ASTM's approval and publication of revisions to ASTM F963 in a revised standard, numbered ASTM F963-23, approved on August 1, 2023. Under section 106(g) of the CPSIA, if ASTM proposes revisions to ASTM F963, ASTM must notify the Commission. 15 U.S.C. 2056b(g). The revised standard shall be considered a consumer product safety standard issued by the CPSC under section 9 of the CPSA (15 U.S.C. 2058), effective 180 days after the date on which ASTM notifies the Commission of the revision, unless, within 90 days after receiving that notice, the Commission notifies ASTM that it has determined that the proposed revision does not improve the safety of toys. 15 U.S.C. 2056b(g).

CPSC is assessing the revised voluntary standard to determine whether the revisions in ASTM F963-23 meet the requirements of CPSIA section 106(g). The Commission invites public comment on that question, to inform staff's assessment and any subsequent Commission consideration of the revisions in ASTM F963-23.<sup>2</sup>

ASTM F963-23 is available for review in several ways. ASTM has provided on its website (at <a href="https://www.astm.org/CPSC.htm">https://www.astm.org/CPSC.htm</a>), at no cost, a read-only copy of the 2023 revisions to ASTM F963, including a red-lined version that identifies the changes made to ASTM F963-17. A read-only copy of the existing mandatory standard (ASTM F963-17) is available for viewing, at no cost, on the ASTM website at: <a href="https://www.astm.org/READINGLIBRARY/">https://www.astm.org/READINGLIBRARY/</a>. Re: Notice of revision to ASTM F963 Standard Consumer Safety Specification for Toy Safety

Dear Ms. Mills:

The Consumer Product Safety Improvement Act of 2008 (CPSIA), PL 110-314, Sec.106(g), instructs ASTM International to notify the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) of revisions to voluntary standards that are a basis for a consumer product safety standard promulgated by the Commission.

(g) REVISIONS.—If ASTM International (or its successor entity) proposes to revise ASTM F963–07, or a successor standard, it shall notify the Commission of the proposed revision. The Commission shall incorporate the revision or a section of the revision into the consumer product safety rule. The revised standard shall be considered to be a consumer product safety standard issued by the Consumer Product Safety Commission under section 9 of the Consumer Product Safety Act (15 U.S.C. 2058), effective 180 days after the date on which ASTM International notifies the Commission of the revision unless, within 90 days after receiving that notice, the Commission notifies ASTM International that it has determined that the proposed revision does not improve the safety of the consumer product covered by the standard. If the Commission so notifies ASTM International with respect to a proposed revision of the standard, the existing standard shall continue to be considered to be a consumer product safety rule without regard to the proposed revision."

We are writing to officially notify the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) that ASTM International has published a revised 2023 version of ASTM F963 *Standard Consumer Safety Specification for Toy Safety*. The 2017 version of F963 is currently adopted as a mandatory consumer product safety standard under section 9 of the Consumer Product Safety Act (16 CFR Part 1250). We are enclosing a redlined document highlighting the specific technical changes between the 2017 and 2023 versions of the standard to help facilitate review by the CPSC Staff.
