Record of Commission Action
Commissioners Voting by Ballot
Placed in the Record at Open Commission Meeting
May 27, 1992

At the May 27, 1992, meeting of the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, the staff briefed the Commission on a final rule addressing the risk of injury and death presented by infant cushions. No decisions were made.

Chairman Jacqueline Jones-Smith convened today's meeting. Commissioners Carol G. Dawson and Mary Sheila Gall were present.

Ballot Vote Decisions. The following decisions made by ballot vote of the Commissioners were placed into the record.

1. Revision of Regulation on Costs Chargeable in Connection with Relabeling and Reconditioning Inadmissible Imports (Due 5/14/92)

The Commission voted unanimously (3-0) to approve the Federal Register notice which revises 16 C.F.R. 1500.272 pertaining to costs chargeable in connection with relabeling and reconditioning inadmissible imports. Voting to approve were Chairman Jones-Smith, Commissioner Dawson, and Commissioner Gall.

2. Carbon Monoxide Detector Article (Due 5/21/92)

The Commission voted unanimously (3-0) to approve an article concerning carbon monoxide detectors that meet the revised Underwriters Laboratories standard. Voting to approve were Chairman Jones-Smith, Commissioner Dawson, and Commissioner Gall.
