Final Orders on Four Provisionally Accepted Consent
Agreements (FFA - Carpets)

(Memorandum from Office of Secretary April 8, 1976)

DECISION

On January 8, 1976, the Commission provisionally accepted consent agreements executed by three firms -- (1) General Felt Industries t/a Falcon Carpet Mills; (2) Jorge's Carpet Mills, Inc.; and (3) Colony Carpets, Inc., -- in connection with alleged violations of the Standard for the Surface Flammability of Carpets and Rugs (DOC FF 1-70). On January 29, 1976, a consent agreement executed by Continental Industries, Inc., d/b/a Modulon Carpets, also in connection with alleged violations of DOC FF 1-70, was provisionally accepted by the Commission. The agreements and related proposed complaints in these four matters were placed on the public record for a sixty-day comment period pursuant to Federal Trade Commission rules which govern Commission procedures under the Flammable Fabrics Act.

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Having received no comments in these matters, the
Commission approves issuance of final orders to cease
and desist.
