Commissioners Voting by Ballot
Placed in the Record at Open Commission Meeting
July 27, 1994

At the July 27, 1994, meeting of the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, the staff briefed the Commission in open session on issues related to the agency's budget for fiscal year 1996. No decisions were made.

Chairman Ann Brown convened today's meeting. Commissioner Mary Sheila Gall and Commissioner Jacqueline Jones-Smith were present.

Ballot Vote Decisions. The following decisions made by ballot vote of the Commissioners were placed into the record.

1. Federal Register Notice Requesting Comment on Petition PP 94-1 for an Exemption from the PPPA Requirements for Iron-Containing Supplements (Due 7/21/94)

The Commission voted unanimously (3-0) to publish a Federal Register notice inviting written comments on Petition PP 94-1, from Douglas Ingoldsby of Nutritech, Inc.

2. Letter of Denial of Petition CP 92-1 Requesting Amendment of the Architectural Glazing Standard (Due 7/22/94)

The Commission voted 2-0-1 to approve a letter concerning the Commission's denial of Petition CP 92-1, from O'Keefe's, Inc. (Ref: Record of Commission Action, 11/3/93) Commissioner Gall and Commissioner Jones-Smith voted to approve the letter as drafted. Chairman Brown abstained from voting on this document because she did not participate in the original decision to deny the petition, which occurred before Chairman Brown took office.

3. ANPR for Baby Walkers (Due 7/22/94)

The Commission voted 2-0-1 to approve an advance notice of proposed rulemaking (ANPR) for publication in the Federal Register initiating a proceeding to address the risk of falls down stairs in baby walkers. Chairman Brown and Commissioner Jones-Smith voted to approve the ANPR. Commissioner Gall abstained from voting on this document because she dissented from the original decision to publish an ANPR.
