Statement of Commission Policy Regarding the Status of Purported Votes by Three Former Commissioners from June 16, 2025 through July 23, 2025

On May 8, 2025, President Donald J. Trump removed Commissioners Hoehn-Saric, Trumka, and Boyle from the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC). On June 13, 2025, a federal district court reinstated the three former Commissioners. Following their court-ordered reinstatement, the three former Commissioners purported to schedule and take several votes over the objections of acting Chairman Feldman and Commissioner Dziak. On July 23, 2025, the United States Supreme Court granted the President's application for a stay of the district court's decision. As a result of that stay, the three former Commissioners have again been removed from their positions at the CPSC.

To avoid confusion, the Commission makes the following statement of policy regarding the validity of the votes purportedly taken by three former Commissioners:

1. The Commission states that all votes purportedly taken by the three former Commissioners on June 17, 2025, June 20, 2025, and June 25, 2025 are null and void and of no force and effect. In furtherance of this, the Commission directs the Secretary to remove from the CPSC's website any Record of Commission Action (RCA) for those votes and to attach them to the RCA memorializing the Commission's vote on this Statement of Commission Policy.
2. The Commission further states that the statements entitled "Commission Policy Regarding Reductions in Force and Staff Details," contained as part of a package which the three former Commissioners purported to approve on June 17, 2025, and "Reiterating and Strengthening the Commission Policy Regarding Reductions in Force," purportedly approved by the three former Commissioners on June 26, 2025, are null and void, of no force and effect, and do not constitute the general policies of the Commission under Section 4(f)(2) of the Consumer Product Safety Act (CPSA), 15 U.S.C. § 2053(f)(2).
