Re: ASTM F2115-19 Standard Specification for Motorized Treadmills

Dear Mr. Koury,

U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) staff requests that the subcommittee on fitness products, ASTM F08.30, develop requirements in ASTM F2115-19 to address hazards we have seen in incident data pertaining to treadmills. CPSC staff<sup>1</sup> is aware of one recent fatality and other injury or near-miss incidents involving children and operating treadmills. Specifically, the incidents show that some treadmills can entrap children and other objects underneath the rear roller on an operating treadmill. If a task group is established, CPSC staff would be willing to participate and assist in developing additional safety requirements for the standard. The CPSC staff representative will be Susan M.
