Amendment 1 to an Agreement between the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) and the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) (#CPSC-I-10-0015, Mod 1; NIST Tracking # 776)

This provides clearance for the attached Amendment 1 to an agreement between NIST and CPSC.

Pursuant to an underlying agreement between the parties that was executed in August 2010, NIST agreed to evaluate for CPSC smoke alarm performance from kitchen fires under various installation locations and fire scenarios. CPSC agreed to pay NIST all of its actual costs by CPSC, estimated to be \$425,000. The end-product was to be a report based on information obtained from a minimum of 24 common cooking fire and nuisance scenarios. The agreement would terminate September 30, 2011.

The subject amendment extends the period of performance of that agreement until December 31, 2011. All other terms remain unchanged. Although CPSC obligated fiscal year 2010 funds through the underlying agreement, CPSC previously determined that the services in question are non-severable in nature and satisfies a fiscal year 2010 bona fide need of CPSC. Therefore, the funds remain available for NIST to complete the work by the end of the extended period of performance established by this amendment.

The agreement, as amended, is authorized by the Consumer Product Safety Act, 15 U.S.C. § 2078(d), which states:

The Commission shall, to the maximum extent practicable, utilize the resources and facilities of the National Institute of Standards and Technology, on a reimbursable basis, to perform research and analyses related to risks of injury associated with consumer

products (including fire and flammability risks), to develop test methods, to conduct studies and investigations, and to provide technical advice and assistance in connection with the functions of the Commission.

CPSC's has "programmatic" authority to undertake the activities contemplated by this agreement under the Fire Prevention and Control Act of 1974, 15 U.S.C. § 2201 et seq. NIST has "programmatic" authority to conduct the requested work pursuant to 15 U.S.C. § 278f.

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1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this amendment is to extend the termination date by 90 days from the expiration of the original agreement for interagency Agreement, Number CPSC-i-10-0015. This is pertaining to the project on Smoke Alarm Performance in Kitchen Scenario Fires. Extension is needed in order to complete testing, analysis, and report preparation under Phases 4 and 5 of the project, delayed due to construction in our large-scale test facility that has required testing be transferred to an offsite location. While testing should be largely complete by the original end date, additional time is still required for analysis and report preparation.

The deliverables are non-severable for the following reasons: All tasks (phases) laid out in the description of services apply only to completion of the objective of the evaluation of smoke alarm performance from kitchen fires under various installation locations and fire scenarios and to assess the propensity for nuisance alarming based on the alarm technology and distance from the cooking appliance. CPSC obtains no benefit from the completion of any individual phase described. The final report with NIST's analysis and conclusions is the only benefit CPSC will obtain from this agreement.

2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

All other terms and conditions remain the same as stated in the original Interagency Agreement. This amendment will become effective when signed by both parties.
