NEISS Product Code Listing: Items Not Under
CPSC Jurisdiction

An examination of the NEISS Product Code Listing reveals
(1) several products which are not under the jurisdiction
of the Commission; (2) many which are clearly covered ;
(3) several which are questionable because they are arguably
outside the scope of the definition of "consumer product"
in section 3 of the CPSA, or because jurisdiction is limited
under section 31 of the Act; and (4) a few which are subject
to the concurrent jurisdiction of the CPSC and one or more
other federal agencies.

Examples of this fourth category are (1) microwave ovens
which are subject regulation by the Bur. of Radiological
Health, FDA as far as their radiation hazards are concerned,
and CPSC for other hazards; (2) eyeglasses and sunglasses
which are excluded under the CPSA because they are "devices"
under the FD & C Act; but those intended for use by children
are subject to concurrent jurisdiction under the FHSA; and
(3) foods, drugs, and cosmetics excluded under the FHSA and
CPSA, but subject to concurrent jurisdiction with FDA under
the PPPA.

Examples of the questionable category include utility meters,
trains, construction materials, and farm equipment. Resolution
of the categorization of these products must await treatment
on a case by case basis.

within the jurisdiction of the Commission:
