

SUMMARY OF MEETING: Representatives of the domestic textile and cotton industry met with Commissioner Nord and staff to express the need for a mandatory furniture standard to address smoldering ignition of upholstered

furniture. NTA and DFA members produce textiles in the mid-to-high end price range. Industry representatives discussed problems with the staff's draft proposed standard for small open flame (SOF) ignition; of particular concern is the variability and availability of the standard test foam and fabric.
