Pursuant to 16 C.F.R. part 1025.68(e)(1), I, Robert S. Adler, am formally¹ forwarding to the Secretary of the Consumer Product Safety Commission the attached communications that I received from Mr. Shihan Qu on Tuesday, February 18, 2014, while I attended the Toy Industry Association's (TIA) Toy Fair 2014 at the Javits Center in New York, NY.

Pursuant to 16 C.F.R. part 1025(e)(2)(ii), I am providing the following information regarding my brief conversation with Mr. Shihan Qu on Tuesday, February 18, 2014:

C. Date, time, duration, and circumstances of communication:

Mr. Qu approached me on Tuesday, February 18, 2014, mid-morning, after I finished speaking at the TIA's Toy Safety Seminar. We spoke for a few minutes.

D. Statement of matters discussed:

At first, Mr. Qu did not identify himself. He approached me and asked whether the Commission considers public opinion when taking action. I told him that we do consider public opinion along with a number of other factors when deciding whether to take regulatory or enforcement action. Mr. Qu said he wanted to give me a file folder of documents that he described as copies of petitions to the Commission regarding Zen Magnets. I told him that he should send the petitions in to the Commission's headquarters to be entered into the record. Mr. Qu replied that they had already been sent in and that these were copies, which were addressed to me. I responded that I would submit them to the Commission upon my return to the office.

¹ Upon my return from my trip to New York my staff turned over the attached communications to the Office of Secretary. Subsequently, I was advised by the Office of the General Counsel to submit the communications with a statement describing the circumstances upon which I received the communications.

E. Whether person persisted in continuing the communication:

After I told Mr. Qu that I would submit his communications to the Commission for the record, I told him that I was unable to continue our conversation. He did not persist in continuing the conversation.

Greetings,

I'm writing to you to retract the administrative complaints against Zen Magnets and Maxfield & Oberton, and stop the retail stop-sale requests of magnet spheres in the US. These requests have nearly nearly destroyed the magnet sphere industry, impede the freedoms of all Americans, and endanger a beautiful medium of art.

A retail prohibition of magnet spheres is not the proper reaction to the misuse of high powered magnets. A broken product should be taken off the shelves, but magnet spheres are not defective, and do not need to be taken off the market. They just need to be out of the mouths of children.

Consumer safety is an important duty, and it is truly regrettable that despite product warnings, there have been dozens of injuries due to child ingestion out of the millions of magnet sphere sets sold in the past three years. However, just as is the case with firearms, swimming pools, and balloons, the solution to the safety problem is education and not prohibition or intimidation.

Federal regulation ASTM F963 clearly states that magnets must be labeled 8+ for strong magnetic science kits, and 14+ for strong magnetic toys. All magnet sphere manufacturers already comply with this regulation. The CPSC's assertion of hazard against the magnet sphere industry is also inconsistent with other existing dangers. For example, 100,000 trampoline injuries will require an ER visit in the United States, and 30 children a year drown in buckets.

I am calling for the public reversal of requests made by the CPSC to remove magnet spheres from the retail market. When it comes to product safety, every one of the links is responsible: companies, parents, children.

On your website you said "Since 2010, there have been at least 43 incidents of children and toddlers who accidentally swallowed these magnets, according to the CPSC, with an increase in incidents each year. In 2005, a 20-month-old boy died after he swallowed nine magnets." The 20-month-old boy swallowed nine magnets resulting in death. The boy did not buy the magnets and assume any risks involved, the parents did, and it was their fault he had access to the magnets, and must have been left unattended to have enough time to swallow nine. If your familiar with the stages of grief, the first, denial, also involves refusing any responsibility, and i belief this was the case. However bad it may sound, the parents, or whoever caused this accident did not want to admit to them self that they caused the untimely death of a child, and instead sought to vindicate their actions by accusing the manufacturer. Your website continues..." In March of this year, a 3-year-old girl in Oregon swallowed 37 high-powered Buckyballs magnets, which tore at least three holes in her lower intestines and another in her stomach. When accidentally swallowed, these small "rare earth" or "neodymium" magnets can twist intestines, causing bowel ulcerations, intestinal damage, blood poisoning and even death." This case is very similar to the first, why was this young girl left to play with the obviously small and swallowable magnets. Small children are know for putting anything and everything in their mouth, and the parents should have known that. Overall, while the children of course cannot be held responsible, the companies that make the magnets have clear warnings, and thus should not be held responsible either. The parents need to accept responsibility for their children, as they do with other aspects of their life. Parents do not sue the companies that make electrical outlets because they let their child put a fork in one.</p> <p>Along the same thought train, your power as a Senator could be put to better use. There are literally thousands of ways children die ever year, and while I may sound cynical in saying this, your statistic, "Since 2010, At Least 43 Children Have Ingested High-Powered Magnets, Causing Severe Stomach and Intestinal Damage" is not very significant. That equates to a little more than 20 a year, not all of which dying, but only sustaining "Severe Stomach and Intestinal Damage". Even if all 20 died in one year, 115 children died from September 2010 to August 2011 from flu. Flu is widespread and is statistically causing more problems, so why not help with that? I find it not only frustrating but incredibly disheartening that the people in power are fretting over such trivial problems.</p> <p>Here in America, we enjoy a host of liberties that many fought and died for. The law says that cigarettes cannot be sold to anyone under 18, but if police see a 5-year-old smoking, they can do nothing about it. I feel an item like that should be #1 on the agenda, not fretting over irresponsible parents giving young children small magnets.</p> <p>In conclusion, you should stop your support of banning the sale of magnetic spheres to pursue more important issues. The actions you support would be better implemented for other things. You should use your power to spread awareness of more severe problems.
